September 2022 Report from Communities in Bloom (CiB)

Aschim Recordings September 2022 from The Aschim Wanderer

Last month I mentioned the ways that Aschim Rocks and alluded that the Guest Book would back me up.

The first Guest Book for the Aschim Homestead was placed June 6, 2019 with the last entry in that book September 12, 2020. That book, now replaced by others had signatures from individuals to groups such as the Environmental Engineering Tech class and many family groups. Signatures came from all parts of Saskatchewan and provinces such as Alberta, Manitoba, Ontario, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. The two furthest visitors came from Brisbane, Australia and Angola Africa. The book was signed by descendants of Haydukewich and Aschim families. It was signed in all months of the year.

The comments were most revealing. Here are some: "Beautiful, Amazing, Awesome, nice hiking trails, wonderful efforts to preserve this gem, Great History, Well presented, Thanks for preserving our Heritage, Great adventure in the Woods, Very Cool, Love the History, Thanks for keeping the grounds so neat, Great trail – No virus!! And in the time of the Coronavirus, we walked the trail."

Bloom and Aschim have not sat idly by – we had a great Family Day on August 13 with free treats, drinks, games and prizes. We even had a guessing contest and found out that the tallest tree around the yard is not the one with largest diameter but comes in at 32 metres (106 feet) tall.

Last week the Mini Museum was stocked with period donations including Norwegian skis, logging tools, period agricultural items and household items. Come and see the new items. Enjoy the freshly mowed trails and the emerging fall colours.

Don't Know How to Curl? - No Problem. The Candle Lake Curling Club will be offering free curling lessons at the end of October. It doesn't take long to learn to curl!


Concerned About Your Physical Abilities? - Don't Be. Many of our curlers throw rocks with a stick, so they don't have to bend over.

News from the Resort Village

- As part of our operations plan to responsibly manage the capacity of our lagoons, effective September 1, 2022 the Resort Village will once again be diverting septic haulers to the West Lagoon.
- An Open House to kick-off public engagement on a Sustainability Plan for Candle Lake was held on August 13th. Those attending the event learned more about some of the background issues the Plan will cover and were able to participate in a Q&A and posterboard input exercise. A video overview of the presentation from the event is now available on the project webpage on the Resort Village website.

What is a Sustainability Plan?

- It is a guide for decision making, particularly about important issues related to economic opportunities, quality of life, relationship with nature, and matters of governance and engagement.
- It is an action plan, not a study, that identifies priorities, actions and indicators for measuring success.
- It has a 10-year horizon. It considers directions set by other long-term plans of the community (such as the 20-Year Parks, Open Space and Trails Master Plan currently under development).

The Plan is being developed around four pillars: Governance, Economy, Environment and Society. Residents are encouraged to share their thoughts and opinions through the surveys created for each pillar. Scan the QR codes below or enter the link in your browser to access the surveys.
