News from the Trails Advisory Board

Spring Hiking



Hiking in the spring is a unique experience. The forest around Candle Lake will be coming back to life as the warm sunshine takes the place of the frosty winter. Remember that there are plenty of hazards you need to watch out for while hiking in spring, just like any other season.

Spring weather and trail conditions can be unpredictable. While it might not be as cold consistently as winter, weather can vary widely. Conditions can change dramatically in just a short period of time. Even if sunshine is in the forecast, bring warm clothing just in case.



Some of Candle Lake Trails see little traffic and are not maintained during winter months. As snow melts, these trails may be washed out or under water in areas. Trails that were groomed throughout the winter for cross-country skiing may have ridges of ice where snow was packed by ski tracks. Please be cautious of these ridges while hiking West End and Bay Lake Trails.

Animals should be considered when heading out for a hike. While walking your furry friend please ensure waste is picked up and disposed of appropriately. Several dog waste-bag receptacles have been placed at trailheads and in the community. These small bags reap havoc to our garbage truck so they should be disposed of inside a larger household waste bag. This allows the RVCL Waste Management Team to handle waste pick-up and transport more efficiently.

Wild animal activity peaks during the spring. Bears are coming out of hibernation after a long winter. Deer, elk, and other foragers are active, and many animals are giving birth to their young. Please don't approach wild animals and carry bear spray as a precautionary measure.

Finally, early spring can be a very enjoyable time to hike as insect populations are minimal. Take advantage of this time to get out on one of Candle Lake's many hiking trails!

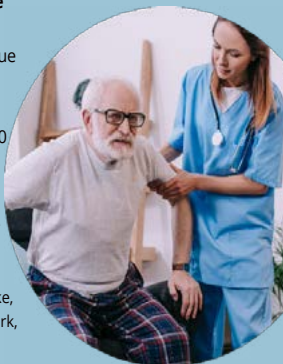

Our committee aims to analyze the data from the survey and focus groups to pinpoint essential health needs and available community resources. Following this, we will collaborate with healthcare providers and the SHA to formulate targeted strategies for addressing these needs. Armed with detailed survey results, we will be equipped to make well-informed decisions, explore ways for community involvement, and strategize for our community's health future.

News from **Communities in Bloom**



You may wonder what does the CL Communities In Bloom do here in our community. This hardworking group is involved in a multitude of activities. Let's highlight a few.

- Most of the beautification, planting and caring for flower beds, hanging baskets. Ongoing watering is done by the resort Village of Candle Lake.
- Recycling of the beverage cans and bottles collected through the collection points around Candle Lake. There are numerous locations where your beverage bottle recycling can be dropped off. This CIB service is a task that many volunteers help with.
- Aschim Homestead Heritage Forest, located south of Candle Lake is a 320-acre site homesteaded by the A. Aschim family. It features a two-storey log house with some furnishings of the day, outbuildings, a demonstration woodlot, refurbished benches and interpretive nature trails. The boardwalk leads to the "long lost climbing tree." Visitors have potential to view beavers in their natural habitat. Candle Lake Communities in Bloom received the "Heritage Recognition Award" in 2020 for their ongoing work at the Aschim Homestead Heritage Forest.

News from the **Resort Village**

55+ HOUSING PROJECT UPDATE

The Candle Lake 55+ Housing Project is seeking ways to support its permanent residents by providing specialized, supported housing options that will allow aging residents to remain in Candle Lake longer.

In December, the Resort Village issued an Expression of Interest (EOI) to attract and pre-qualify builders/developers who would own and construct a new seniors housing development in Candle Lake. Multiple developers submitted information and have been selected to participate in a detailed Request for Proposal which will use a detailed and comprehensive process to procure a developer(s) to design, build, own, market or operate a new seniors development to meet the needs expressed within the community through the Housing Needs and Demand Assessment completed in 2022-2023.

At the February 22nd Council Meeting, the Resort Village Council commissioned Wallace Insights to assist the Resort Village Seniors Housing Initiative Committee in the RFP process.
