Fun Run Provides Grant for Trails




On August 25, 2023, Brent Loehndorf, Chair of the Candle Lake Fun Run, presented a cheque for \$16,000.00 to Dave Werrett, Chairperson of the Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board. This grant will be used to develop a "Fun Run Trail" that will provide a safe pedestrian and cyclist connection route from the Bayview commercial area to the Hall and recreation facilities, as well as to the Bay Lake Trails.

We are very fortunate to have been awarded this grant and appreciate all the great work the Fun Run is doing to enhance our community by bringing people together and promoting positive mental health.

The Resort Village of Candle Lake has begun work on Fun Run Trail. Please be cautious around equipment and workers when travelling in or around the area.

Sharing our Candle Lake Activity Trails – Human Powered Activity



All Candle Lake Activity Trails are intended for "human-powered" activities such as walking, running, cycling and skating (where practical).

If you are cycling or skating on the trails, please adjust your speed when approaching pedestrians and warn of your presence with a quick bell ring or call-out that you are passing on the left. If you are walking on the trails and a cyclist or skater approaches, please respect their use of the trail by moving to the side and allowing safe space for everyone.

In the winter some of our trails are groomed for cross-country skiing or designated as snowshoe friendly. Some activities are not compatible on one trail as they may break down groomed tracks. The Activity Trails Map and Winter Ski Maps, available at local businesses or online on the RVCL Website, provide advice on suitable and recommended activities for each trail.


Candle Lake Curling Club

New Physician Services at Candle Lake Primary Health Care Centre

The Resort Village of Candle Lake, together with the Candle Lake Health Services Committee, is pleased to announce Dr. Jordan Wingate will take on the role of physician at the Candle Lake Primary Health Care Centre starting October 3, 2023.



Dr. Wingate will provide family physician services one day a week (on Tuesdays) with Rhonda Fairburn providing support.

Dr. Wingate is a rural family physician originally from Regina, Saskatchewan. After receiving his medical degree from the University of Saskatchewan

in 1996, he completed his residency in Family Medicine through the University of Saskatchewan's rural residency training program. Dr. Wingate has been practicing medicine, emergency, obstetrics, and hospital care in Melfort since 1998. He has also served in various leadership roles within the health care system and is a clinical

professor for the University of Saskatchewan and site coordinator for the Department of Family Medicine. He was also recently appointed the Deputy Chief Medical Officer for the province and will be sharing his time with this administrative work and his clinical practice at Candle Lake.

The Centre is now accepting appointment requests for Dr. Wingate. Welcome Dr. Wingate!

With the departure of Holly Young, we continue our search for a full time Nurse Practitioner. Until this position is filled, we will continue using the services of casual status Nurse Practitioners (Claudia Pearson and others) as they are available.

We look forward to our collaborative practice environment changing, growing, and thriving to meet the health care needs of the Candle Lake and area population.

Thank you to Holly for her support and commitment to the Centre over the years, and for her efforts in meeting the demands of her new role and clinical services to the community through the summer months. We wish her the best in all her future endeavours!

With the arrival of October and autumn the summer work for the folks involved with Communities in Bloom is drawing to a close.


