News From Communities In Bloom

In 2022 we saw a return to regular events and projects for Communities in Bloom. Using our Mission Statement and project guidelines, we added new projects and supported community requests for financial help.

2022 Highlights:

- Thanks to the generous donations from residents and visitors to Candle Lake, we had an abundance of cans, bottles and other recyclables to sort, bag and take to Sarcan in Prince Albert. Transportation of the recyclables to Sarcan, Prince Albert was undertaken by an excellent crew of volunteers. This is an excellent fund raiser for our committee and the funds raised support a variety of projects in and around Candle Lake.
- The regular collection of bottles and cans at the beaches, trailer parks, village grounds and businesses, plus the sorting and bagging saw over 300 hours of volunteer service just for sorting and bagging.
- The flowers ordered from the Star City Colony and hung by the Village crew in early June were soon thriving and looking beautiful. An improved watering and fertilizing schedule followed by the Village workers produced much better results. Several garden beds are planted and maintained by volunteers.
- "Welcome to the Lake" during the May long weekend - We had a table of information and a full summary of our projects with pictures on a nearby board. We raffled a beautiful basket of flowers.
- Spring projects concluded with a special event adjacent to the Candle Lake Community Garden. On June 18th there was a celebration of the National Year of the Garden. In partnership with Community Gardens, Communities in Bloom and the Library Board, a Garden Fair was held and featured: a perennial plant exchange, Garden Tour, gardening information in pamphlets from University of Saskatchewan, vendors, food trucks, plant sales, vegetables from the Star City Colony for sale and rocks and birdhouses ready for painting in the nearby gazebo, courtesy of library volunteers. It was a beautiful summer-like day, well received and attended by the community.
- Along with submissions to The Wave we added regular contributions about Communities in Bloom to Candle Lake Facebook pages.
- Funds were donated to Communities in Bloom in memory of Jacky Murray, resident of Candle Lake. We assisted the family in choosing a bench for Waskateena beach (Depeel) and a Memorial Tree planted on the Village Grounds.
- During the summer we sold 50/50 tickets at the Women's, Men's and Mixed Golf evenings courtesy of the owners of the Candle Lake Golf Resort. These funds support our many projects and we sincerely thank the owners and the golfers.
- We added a display to the Mystical Forest.
- In late August we hosted a supper and evening for the many volunteers who assist CiB with its projects and work.
- We were very happy to be a major sponsor of the Candle Lake Fun Run held in September.
- We purchased two exercise stations that were installed in late fall along the Waskateena Walking Trail.
- We donated funds for the park being built by the residents of Harbour Golf Estates.
- Volunteer work continued during the summer and into fall at the Aschim Homestead Heritage Forest with the maintenance and upgrading of trails and boardwalks and extending boardwalks to Birchbark Creek.
- Late in the year a second blue bin was built for bottles and cans and it was put in place by the recycling Building at the landfill.

The yearly Pitch in and Clean event will take place after the May long weekend. Thanks to the groups and clubs who do a great job of cleaning the areas in and around our Resort Village. Bags are available at the Village Office for groups to use.

Aschim Homestead Faces a Late Spring in 2023

After a winter of heavily used trails by both snowshoers and hikers, Aschim Homestead and trails await the many walkers and tourists this spring and summer although the late spring will push back the “usability” of some of the more remote parts. The main trail into the house and yard will be accessible.

CiB and their volunteers finished the last major boardwalk construction last fall. This section allows one to walk right to the banks of Birchbark Creek at Canoe Landing just as in the “old days”. With an expanded budget we will be offering better bear proof garbage containers, improved signage purchased last year, repairs of loose and missing boards on previously built sections, more items in the “mini museum” and carefully mowed and trimmed trails. The attention to detail of the historical and natural beauty site allowed CiB to win the Provincial Heritage Recognition Award for The Aschim Homestead and Heritage Forest in 2020. CiB is proud to be the acting arm of the Resort Village of Candle Lake in the management of the Aschim properties.

Small work bees will be convened this spring to complete some of the repairs needed. If you have a cordless drill and would like some time out in nature, give Ed Horn a call at (306) 960-1666 and arrangements can be made to be part of a work bee. Best time to work is before the mosquitoes come out. See you on the trails.

Province Directs SGI to Create Golf Cart Use Pilot Project

You may have seen in the news that this week, that at the annual Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA) convention, Mayor Terry Kostyna presented a SUMA resolution that would permit communities in Saskatchewan to enact bylaws allowing people to drive golf carts on municipal roads under specific circumstances.

Permitting Golf Carts on municipal roadways at Candle Lake could become a part of our overall neighborhood connectivity plan. Golf Carts could help people with limited mobility, access beaches, parks and playgrounds, where nearby parking and unhindered access can sometime be difficult to find. A Golf Cart Bylaw would outline the operating regulations and a licensing system similar to the current ATV permitting process could be implemented for golf cart use as well.

While no details about the project were provided at the SUMA convention, this is a topic that has been discussed for some time in Candle Lake. In fact, a bylaw had been passed in August 2020 to allow golf cart use on certain Resort Village roads, but then rescinded as Council felt that local bylaws on this topic should be in line with any future provincial legislation.

The SUMA resolution passed with support from the majority of communities in the province. Afterword, the Minister responsible for SGI announced we will see a pilot program created within the province. The Resort Village will keep you up to date on whether the Resort Village is chosen as a potential site for the pilot. Any decisions made on the pilot project and/or a future bylaw would be discussed at a future public council meeting.
