News from the Health Committee

The Candle Lake Health Committee has been working very hard on several initiatives for the community including:

- Increasing Health Clinic operations to five days per week with full time Nurse Practitioner service or physician coverage.
- Strategies to provide phlebotomy service in Candle Lake. The Committee is negotiating with the Saskatchewan Health Authority to allow a contracted Phlebotomist to service Candle Lake and the surrounding community. (Phlebotomy technicians collect blood from patients and prepare the samples for testing.)
- Promoting utilization of Home Care Services in Candle Lake.
- Promoting the expanded scope of the Pharmacist.
- Researching the feasibility of virtual care or telehealth service at Candle Lake.

Earth Day is held each year to promote awareness of our environment and to recognize that there are ways that we can all make a difference and reduce our impact. Earth Day is April 22nd every year all around the world. Over six million Canadians join 500 million people in over 180 other countries in staging events and projects focusing on environmental issues in their areas.

Here are few popular and familiar ideas that will remind us that as individuals we can make a difference. We can continue to try to make Earth Day... every day!

- Wash full loads in your dishwasher. Wash a small sink full by hand.
- Wash full loads of clothes in your washing machine and hang them to dry when the weather is favourable.
- Use cold water for your wash cycle.
- Use your dryer right away if you have more than one load. This allows the drier to use the heat left over from the previous cycle and be more efficient.
- Approximately 15 million trees are harvested annually to meet the demand for the 10 billion paper bags that are used each year. The use of reusable bags can make a difference!
- Spring Cleaning use non-toxic cleaning solutions such as baking powder for scouring and white vinegar in water for floors and windows.
- Thinking about buying a car? Consider a gas-electric hybrid and you will save gas and money.
- To conserve water in the bathroom, try to take shorter showers – about 5 minutes. Alternatively, you can install water efficient showerheads.

- Use cloth towels and napkins instead of paper.
- Use washable utensils and plates instead of throwaway plastic picnic gear.
- · Use a lunchbox and thermos for school or work.
- Share magazines and newspapers with a friend or neighbour.
- Donate used goods such as clothing, furniture and toys to a thrift shop, day care or charity.
- Recycle the accepted paper, plastics, and tin cans.
- If you care about clean air and water, get involved and make your voice heard! Write a letter or e-mail to your elected representative and let them know that the environment matters to you.
- Not too far? Walk, bike or car pool.
- Turn off the lights when you leave a room.

The best way to help the environment is to learn more about your surrounding ecosystem. Take a hike, go on an animal or bird watch, or simply have a picnic. Spending time outdoors will give you a better look at the natural world around you. Having knowledge about local plants and animals and your impact on these habitats will allow you to make more informed decisions. Protecting our lake from harmful insecticides, weed killers and mercury are our responsibilities.

North Central Lakelands District Official Community Plan

The North Central Lakelands District Official Community Plan Update project will be hosting a come-and-go open house in conjunction with the Welcome Back To The Lake event at Candle Lake on Saturday, May 20. More details will be shared in the May issue of The WAVE.

Planning for the Future

At the March 16 Council Meeting, three planning documents that directly relate to an enhanced quality of life for Resort Village residents and visitors were adopted by Council.

Candle Lake 20 Year Master Plan for Parks, Opens Spaces and Trails

There has been significant community interest expressed in preserving and enhancing the natural beauty of our community. The Candle Lake 20 Year Master Plan for Parks, Opens Spaces and Trails will help guide our decision-making and policy-setting regarding existing and future recreation infrastructure in the short, medium and long term. With priorities identified, we will be in better position to act quickly when funding or development opportunities arise. Thank you to everyone who provided their input and feedback to this important planning document!

Candle Lake Emergency Services Master Plan

In October 2022 the provincial government passed legislation that requires all fire departments (volunteer or otherwise) to formally declare the level of service they can provide to a community or area. Educated decision-making is critical to the provision of emergency services, particularly as the Resort Village continues to grow. The Candle Lake Emergency Services Master Plan is a plan to enhance emergency services in the Resort Village over the next 10 years, including services to address the risk of wildfire. It provides direction and an implementation framework that can be aligned with operational planning and our budget process and creates a pathway to help us meet provincially mandated requirements.

Resort Village of Candle Lake Housing Needs and Demand Assessment

The recently completed Resort Village of Candle Lake Housing Needs and Demand Assessment found that among our population aged 55 and older, there is interest in developing an independent living housing project, and that demand will continue to grow over the next 10 years.

2023 OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The Resort Village of Candle Lake (RVCL) 2023 Operating and Capital Budget was developed to achieve the goals set out in the RVCL 2022-2024 Strategic Plan adopted by Council last year. Over the past number of months, Council has reviewed and deliberated over the budget with efforts to maintain current service levels, while managing rising costs and planning for the future.

For 2023, the Resort Village will implement the following:

- 0% increase in total property tax revenue.
- To accomplish a 0% property tax increase, a new Residential Waste Collection Fee of \$8.33/month will be introduced and collected annually. This fee, together with the new Landfill Gate Fee recently introduced, will cover the entire cost of managing solid waste.
- The Residential Waste Collection Fee will include:
 - weekly streetside waste collection
 - waived gate fees for up to two bags of household garbage weekly
 - free weekends at the landfill over the high season long weekends
 - pick up of bagged/bundled yard refuse and waste each week following summer long weekends, and
 - recycling of residential cardboard and other items
 - A portion of the fee will be put into a reserve to cover the capital cost to develop a landfill cell or transfer station in the future, estimated to be required in about 10 years time.

• The Village will invest over \$5.8 million in operations and capital projects including:

- improved facilities, trails and greenspace
- enhanced emergency services
- equipment replacement
- roadway maintenance and drainage activities
- health services
- utilities, including the decommission of the old landfill cell

- About \$1.3 million of the budget's total expenditures will be funded through federal and provincial grants.
- The Village is also working towards developing a 20year asset management plan to identify any existing shortfall in our capital reserves so that we are prepared for future capital and infrastructure needs.
