News from the Health Services Committee

Candle Lake Health Services Project 2024: “Candle Lake – Alive and Well”

The Candle Lake Health Services Committee believes there are many ways the community can participate and augment the provision of Health Services locally. Searching for answers, we developed an action plan to do just that. We are proud to introduce our 2024 Health Service Project, “Candle Lake – Alive and Well”. The project objectives are to:

- 1) Gain insight into our unique demographics and specific health service needs.
- 2) Identify and bridge service gaps.
- 3) Identify and build support for at-risk and vulnerable populations.
- 4) Support the community's vision for healthy living.
- 5) Fuel enthusiasm for volunteerism.
- 6) Establish a path for financial support for local health services.
- 7) Monitor and strengthen community interventions.
- 8) Strengthen stakeholder partnerships.
- 9) Partner with other health service providers.
- 10) Collaborate with other rural centers.



How will we achieve this? You can read more about the project “Candle Lake – Alive and Well” on the RVCL website under Community Services.

Our action plan starts by identifying the community health needs and resources. In March, we invited 40 Candle Lake residents to 2-hour Focus Group sessions as part of Phase 1 of our survey. We brainstormed for information about health and wellness in our community.

We asked - What services do we use? What works well? Are there barriers and challenges to accessing health services, and what do we want for the future? The ideas flowed from the participants. What we heard was not surprising.

- **Our people are our greatest strength.** We have an amazing, supportive and caring community. We have facilities and services, and every one of the multitude of services and existing social groups promotes well-being: physical, social and spiritual. Health doesn't happen in the hospital! It happens here.

- **We have many opportunities for improvement.** We need to find ways to support the population when health and well-being are challenged. Assist them to find or provide the support they need to overcome or live with their challenge whether young or old. There were so many ideas and insights.

- **For the future** we intend to strengthen our partnerships and work collaboratively with the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA), the provincial government and all stakeholders to assist in the provision of optimal local health service and promotion of healthy living. As a community, we have many opportunities to contribute through supported volunteer work, improved connections to the greater system, and expansion of local services.

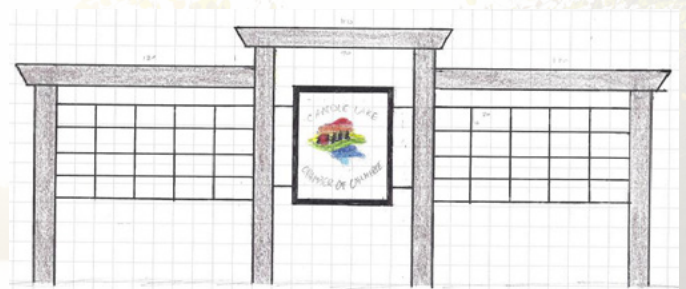

KEEPING SASKATCHEWAN'S BRIGHTEST LIGHT SHINING: REPORTING ON OUR ACTIVITIES

This month, the Resort Village issued the 2023 Report to the Community. This new annual public report is another way the Resort Village is enhancing communication to its residents and visitors to the community.

The Report provides details on activities that were conducted in 2023 in the following areas:

- **Strengthening Operations and Governance:** How we're providing the best service possible by ensuring we have the staff we need to effectively manage the Resort Village, implement stronger internal processes and procedures, and training staff where required.
- **Implementing New Technologies:** How we're advancing our use of technology so we can work more efficiently, work remotely if required, and improve communication to residents.
- **Upgrading our Municipal Utilities to Meet Our Needs:** What we have done to ensure the proper operation of our wastewater system and pursue a long-term solution to address capacity issues at the East Lagoon, and how we're improving and modernizing operations at the Landfill and preparing for its decommissioning.
- **Improving and Maintaining Our Infrastructure:** How we're making needed repairs to roadway infrastructure, developing an annual road repair program and improving drainage within problem areas in the community.
- **Enhancing Our Planning and Development:** How we've modernized existing bylaws and policies and are developing a new Official Community Plan and Zoning Bylaw to both address current needs and help the Resort Village in future planning.
- **Creating More Opportunities for Recreation, Culture & Sport:** How we're ensuring the preservation and enhancement of the natural beauty of our community through the proper development and maintenance of recreation infrastructure, creating new trails and implementing our 20 Year Green Space Master Plan.
- **Enhancing Our Emergency Services:** What we've done to enhance existing services and conduct multi-year planning to ensure these services expand as our community grows.
- **Supporting Commercial Development:** How we're providing better support to help existing local businesses succeed and identify new opportunities for potential business owners and investors.
- **Planning to Meet the Future Needs of Residents:** How we're developing housing options and health services that will allow residents to remain in the Resort Village as they age.

The Report also includes information on the 2023 Resort Village Budget – where our revenue came from and how we planned to spend that revenue to ensure the best possible use of resources.

Who can run for election in a Resort Village?

To be a candidate in a Resort Village election you must:

- be at least 18 years old on the day of the election.
- not be disqualified pursuant to this (The Local Government Election Act, 2015) or any other Act.
- be a Canadian citizen at the time that he/she submits the nomination paper.
- have lived in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he/she submitted the nomination paper, AND:
 1. lived in that resort village, or on land now in that resort village, for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he/she submitted the nomination paper, OR
 2. be the assessed person with respect to property in the resort village, or on property now situated in the resort village, pursuant to Section 207 in The Municipalities Act, for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the date on which he/she submitted the nomination paper, OR
 3. be the spouse of a person mentioned in paragraph 1 or 2 above.

Who can vote in a Resort Village election?

To vote in a resort village election in Saskatchewan, you must:

- be a Canadian citizen;
- be at least 18 years of age and one of the following:
 - a. have lived in the resort village (or on land now in the resort village) for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day;
 - b. be the assessed person with respect to property in the resort village (property now situated in the resort village, refer to Section 207 of The Municipalities Act) for at least three consecutive months immediately before election day; or
 - c. be the spouse of an eligible voter mentioned in a or b.

2024-2025 Budget Approved

Resort Village Council approved the 2024 Operating and Capital Budget during a Special Council Meeting held on March 27. The budget aligns with the objectives outlined in the RVCL 2022-2024 Strategic Plan adopted by Council last year.

During budget planning, Council diligently reviewed and deliberated on the budget, striving to uphold current service standards while effectively managing escalating and inflation related costs and planning for the future at the same time. As part of the planning process, residents were also invited to comment on various measures to address rising costs.

The 2024 Budget includes expenditures totaling \$6.626 million. These funds will be allocated towards operational advancements and capital projects, including infrastructure improvements, trail and greenspace enhancements, upgraded emergency services equipment, necessary machinery, road maintenance, and drainage initiatives. Furthermore, the budget encompasses plans for the rehabilitation of the Community Hall and the decommissioning of the old landfill cell. Approximately \$1.4 million of these expenditures will be supported through federal and provincial grants.

For the fiscal year 2024, the Village has projected revenues of \$6.626 million, with \$3.173 million derived from Property Taxes. Notably, this includes no adjustment to the Mill Rate and Base Tax. Rather, the Resort Village opted to discontinue the property tax prepayment discount, which will result in an annual revenue increase of approximately \$135,000.

Council's goal in preparing this budget was to strike a balance between continuing to invest in essential services without imposing significant tax hikes, however a difficult choice had to be made. With municipalities all over Canada being faced with rising operational costs due to inflation; ultimately the decision to discontinue the discount was needed to ensure existing services can be maintained.

Council believes the ongoing efforts of the Resort Village in developing a comprehensive 20-year asset management plan will help identify any existing deficiencies in capital reserves. This strategic planning, coupled with future investments in subsequent years, is essential to sustain the exceptional quality of life enjoyed by residents of Candle Lake.

Reinspection of Resort Village Properties

Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency (SAMA) is the agency responsible for assessing property values in most rural communities in Saskatchewan. As part of a Province wide initiative, SAMA will be reinspecting all properties in the Resort Village in Candle Lake beginning this spring. The reinspections include a physical examination of all land and buildings and are used to determine property values, which in turn communities use to assess taxes, our main source of revenue. Any increase in property assessment in the Village typically has an inverse impact on the established mill rate and does not necessarily result in an increase to your annual property taxes.
