Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board – 5 Year PLAN 2023 to 2027

Short-Term Plan (budgeted in 2023)

- 1. Extend West Side Trail from Bereskin Drive to Main Street to be completed in 2023
- 2. Establish a land bridge to access a crosswalk on Hwy 265 to the Bayview Business district and better define the walking path in front of the Market
- 3. Extend Simon Lehne Trail to Northview Trail to Nobles Point Marina, with a crosswalk on Simon Lehne to be completed in 2023
- 4. Upgrade cross-country ski track setter by adding weights
- 5. Replace existing trail head garbage cans with bear proof garbage cans
- 6. Establish a dedicated storage area for Trails supplies and materials
- 7. Develop a roadside trail from Deep Bay to the old Telwin access
- 8. Resurface the section of the West Side Trail from Main St to The Market by applying crusher dust.
- 9. Develop a Trail from Bayview to RVCL recreation area and Bay Lake Trails
- 10. Extend the boardwalk on the Nobles Point Nature Trail

Long-Term Plan (not yet budgeted)

- 1. Improve pedestrian access along Simon Lehne
- 2. Recognize and promote the historic significance of Old Horse Trail with signage, in concert with Communities in Bloom
- 3. Develop connectors to the Flood Berm
- 4. Pursue development of a nature trail north of Elm St, West of Simon Lehne, south of Nobles
- 5. Connect the existing Trails system from Van Impe to to Minowukaw
- 6. Support RVCL renewal of the adoption of the Aschim Heritage Homestead property (expiration of current agreement 2029)

Annual (on-going maintenance and sustainability) (budgeted annually)

- 1. Consult on new development applications re trails and pedestrian access
- 2. Maintain accessible entrances to winter ski trails
- 3. Groom winter ski and snowshoe trails
- 4. Identify low, wet, eroded, or damaged areas and recommend maintenance options
- 5. Identify trails that should be closed temporarily due to unsafe or impassible conditions
- 6. Create an annual seasonal task list for Trails maintenance for the RVCL Maintenance Crew
- 7. Update maps, signs, promotional material, and social media to reflect the current trail status
- 8. Boardwalk construction, maintenance, and repair over marshy/wet areas
- 9. Maintain markings/barriers to walking lanes on roadways
- 10. Consult with Community Engineering regarding trails design and trail upgrades
- 11. Partner with Parks & Rec to host Ski/Snowshoe/curling event(s) to promote trails use and community engagement
- 12. Promote Trails by having a display at the Sandy Bay Festival of Lights
