Our citizens at Candle Lake celebrate Earth Day and recycling on a regular basis with their donations of beverage recyclables to Communities in Bloom and add cardboard, plastics and tin cans to the bins at the Landfill and Village grounds.

In late fall of 2021, our local Communities in Bloom committee received The Environmental Action Award in the 2021 Saskatchewan Communities in Bloom program from Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association for the development of a comprehensive recycling program. It recognizes that since 2007 there has been a 14-year effort in conjunction with the Municipal Council to divert materials from the local landfill thus making a significant impact on the community and how it manages waste.

Composting 101

Composting is a wonderful re-cycling facility right at your own home. Food scrapes need not go to the landfill. They can be used in your garden, as organic soil improver. Compost helps improve soil structure, prevent growth of weeds, and regulate moisture in the soil. Most importantly, compost teams with microbial life - good microorganisms, that keep soil healthy and make nutrients available to plants.

What to consider before starting to compost: Amount of space for your composting area - Kind of material you will be using to make compost - How you will use your compost - Time and effort to make healthy compost - How to keep the compost area spic and span.

News from the Saskatchewan Health Authority

Despite the Public Health Order being lifted medical masks are still required in SHA facilities. Wearing a mask protects our vulnerable patients. Thank you for being a part of their care. Many health and safety measures remain in place when you enter SHA facilities, including mandatory masking and entryway screening questions.

Please refer to and follow all posters/signs when visiting SHA facilities. These measures help protect our patients, residents, families and staff from many illnesses including COVID-19.

Check Point Screening (Does Not Apply to Patients)

With the exception of patients, any individual entering a SHA facility will be required to undertake a questionnaire related to COVID-19.

If you answer YES to ANY of the questions below you will not allowed to enter the facility:

1. Are you currently under federal orders to isolate/ quarantine due to recent travel?

2. Have you or someone in your household tested

positive for COVID-19 in the last 10 days?

3. In the last 24 hours, have you had any of the following symptoms?

· Fever (temperature ≥ 38.0 Celsius)

- New or worsening respiratory symptoms NOT RELATED to seasonal or environmental allergies, i.e.
- \cdot Cough or sore throat
- Runny nose
- Shortness of breath
- Difficulty breathing

New onset atypical symptoms including:

- · Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Headache
- · Diarrhea, nausea/vomiting
- Aches and pains or chills
- \cdot Loss of appetite
- Fatigue or weakness

If you answer "No" to all of the above, you will be allowed to enter the facility.

All required infection control practices must be followed while on site. Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe!

Master Plan for Parks, Open Spaces and Trails

Work to develop a 20-year Master Plan for Parks, Open Spaces and Trails at Candle Lake is underway. The Master Plan aims to create a network of multi-use trails and open spaces for local and visitor recreational use.

The objectives of the Master Plan are to:

- Physically connect the community to strengthen its social connections;
- \cdot Meet the recreation needs of residents and visitors today and into the future; and
- Create a green space blueprint for community-wide and neighbourhood-level parks and open spaces.

Crosby Hanna & Associates have been hired to develop a Master Plan to help realize these goals. And Wallace Insights will help us engage with stakeholders and the public throughout the planning process.

We are currently working with them to create a base map of existing assets and opportunities. Through a series of oneon-one chats, emails and two workshops, the perspectives from 16 different stakeholder groups have helped shape the scope and general direction of the plan. These will be developed and tested through the Master Planning process.

The opportunity for the entire Candle Lake community to contribute to and comment on the Plan will begin in May. Monthly updates will be provided in the Wave newsletter and on the Resort Village website.

Our new RCVL website is officially under construction! A design has been approved and RCVL staff are busy creating new content. 2021 Census shows 38% increase in population

The 2021 Census of Population released earlier this year shows an increase of 38.1% in the population of the Resort Village of Candle Lake.

In 2016, the permanent resident population of the RVCL was 840; in 2021 it was 1,160.

Census data is important to the RVCL because grants and revenue sharing is based on population, and it helps us in our short and long-term planning for both policy and local services.

Assessment Role Now Open

The assessment role is open for public inspection for 30 days, from March 25 to April 25 at the Village Office. The role is open for public inspection for 30 days. Property owners can only file an appeal concerning your assessment when the Assessment Roll is open for inspection. You will only receive a notice of reassessment if you made improvements to your property last year.

Drainage

With higher than average snowfall this winter there is bound to be more runoff this spring. You may have seen Village staff opening up culverts and drainage ditches throughout the community in anticipation of the coming thaw. Property owners are encouraged to take steps to mitigate flooding on their own property by moving snow from around their buildings, and keeping approach culverts and ditches clear of snow. Please be considerate and do not move snow onto public or a neighbouring property.

Did you know? Any person placing any material (including snow) on any portion of a street, boulevard or sidewalk (including ditches and public alleys) can be subject to a fine of \$250 to \$5,000. (Bylaw 14-2021)

2022 Village Budget
