Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board Spring Updates

The Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board is pleased that so many people enjoy the trails designed specifically for human-powered use in and around Candle Lake. If you are cycling on a trail, please safely pass pedestrians by slowing down and giving notice of your approach by sounding a bell or vocalizing your presence by announcing "passing on your left". The more notice you give the better to avoid surprise encounters or collision.

It is also important to be aware of the many approaches where vehicular traffic intersects a trail. Please ensure a travel way is clear and safe before proceeding. If you encounter any obstructions or dangerous areas along the trails please submit a Service Request on the Resort Village of Candle Lake (RVCL) website at www.candlelake.ca or contact the Village Office directly by calling (306) 929-2236 to report the details.

To maintain the quality of Candle Lake trails, ATV and other vehicular traffic is not permitted on trails. If you observe inappropriate use of trails, please note the location and the details of the vehicle such as the plate number then report the information to the RVCL 24/7 CSO dispatch at (306) 960-1855.

For safety reasons, a designated pedestrian trail has been established parallel to Hwy 265 in front of the Candle Lake Market. This trail is delineated with parking curbs. While more suitable ways to define this trail are being explored, the CLTAB would like to encourage vehicular traffic to Parallel Park next to the curbs.



Remember to pick up a punch-card with your trail map from local businesses or the RVCL Office, for a chance to enter the 'Trail Exploration Challenge'. The contest is open until August 15th. During your hikes this summer, find the punch-tools that have been placed on trails identified on the punch-card (one punch tool per trail). Punch tools will be clearly visible and identified with a red trail marker. Use the unique punch tool associated to the space on the punch-card for the trail you are hiking. Successfully find and punch your card with three (3) of the five (5) punch tools to be entered into a draw for a Yeti cooler! Completed punch-cards can be dropped off at the Village Office to be entered into the draw. Please respect the environment by staying on designated trails and have fun exploring Candle Lake trails!

News from the Resort Village

Waste Disposal and Collection

You may have noticed the RVCL has initiated improvements to the operation of the landfill. As part of these changes, at the June Council Meeting, the RVCL passed a new bylaw regulating the use of the landfill and transportation of waste in the Village. These changes are required to ensure our facility conforms to provincial regulations and remain viable now and into the future.

As previously announced as part of the 2023 budget, each residential property owner has been invoiced a \$100 annual waste collection fee in June (equal to \$8.33 per month). To avoid interest charges, this waste collection fee is payable within 30 days of receipt.

As a reminder, the Resort Village provides residential property owners with weekly streetside collection, free landfill gate fees for up to 2 bags of household garbage per week, 3 free landfill weekends on the long weekends in May, August and September, plus free yard refuse pickup the weeks following the long weekends during which our staff will pick up yard refuse along with your regular waste.

Yard refuse must be bagged in clear bags may not exceed 20 kgs. Commercial property owners are responsible for the disposal of their own waste.
