Candle Lake Trails **Advisory Board**

Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board Receives Fun Run Grant – Thank You!

The Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board is excited to be the recipient of a \$16,000 grant from Candle Lake Fun Run Inc. We are extremely grateful for the opportunities this funding provides our community.

This funding will be used for Phase 1 of a new initiative to develop a trail connecting Bayview Drive (connector to West Side Trail) to the Resort Village office area (Hall / Curling Rink / Tennis Courts / entrance to Bay Lake Trails). The “Candle Lake Fun Run” trail will follow the tree line from Bayview Drive approximately 1 km to the Resort Village recreation area.

The Trail Development Plan for this initiative was approved by RVCL Council in 2022, subject to funding. The plan is to start the project in 2023 with completion planned for 2024. Phase 1 will include tree and brush-cutting, blading, applying aggregate, levelling, and compacting the surface. Phase 2 will complete the trail to the same hard-surface standards as the West Side Trail by applying crusher dust. Completion of Phase 2 will depend on future funding.

Currently there is no maintained trail in this area – all pedestrian/cycling traffic must access the recreation area via Highway #265 along with vehicle traffic.

Developing this trail from Bayview to the Recreation Hub and Bay Lake Trails will provide safer pedestrian access and more opportunities for all Candle Lake community members and our many visitors to come together in the recreation hub and enjoy nature and human-powered activities at the same time. We believe that physical activity and social interaction facilitate good mental health and well-being.

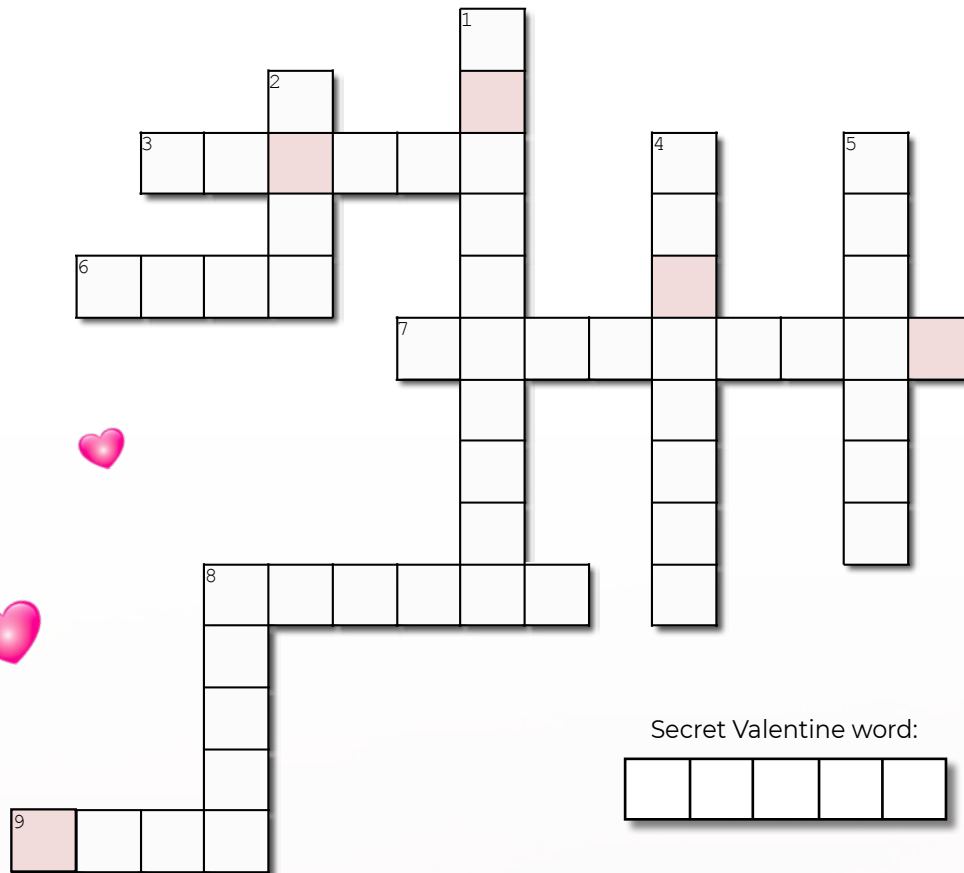

Council Passes Animal Control Bylaw 09-2022

Candle Lake is located in one of the most beautiful locations in the Boreal Forrest of Saskatchewan. Co-habitation with local wildlife is something we all appreciate and love, but it needs to be done respectfully to ensure the health and safety for all.

The Resort Village has been receiving an increasing number of calls about sightings of coyotes and wolves in the community. Predators are attracted into the community in search of food. This can include garbage that has been left out, or small pets or other domesticated animals. In addition, predators prey on other wildlife that may live or be attracted to the community. Council has passed an Animal Control Bylaw (09-2022) that will regulate the type of animals that can be raised in the community and restrict the practice of feeding wildlife that can encourage or attract wildlife into the community. Emergency Services Masterplan

The Resort Village is conducting an operational review to identify challenges and opportunities faced by the Village when it comes to providing Emergency Services. Based on this review, we will be developing an Emergency Services Masterplan which will include recommendations for future direction and priorities for services provided by the Candle Lake Fire Department, Medical First Responders and Emergency Measures Organization. The Plan will provide a roadmap to enhance services delivered by Emergency Services based on today's population as well as projected population as our community continues to grow.
