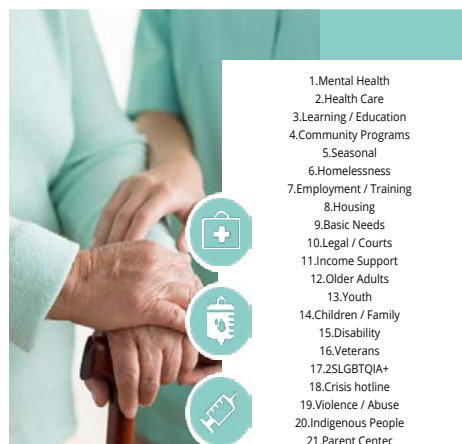



REGISTER YOUR VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERA

Residents and business owners that have video surveillance cameras are encouraged to register their address and contact information with Candle Lake COPPS. The registry will increase the efficiency of law enforcement officers in gathering pertinent video footage if an event occurs near your address. Your information is kept secure and confidential. Only the RCMP or Community Safety Officers will ever ask your explicit permission to view the video footage, and only the COPPS database administrators will ever see who has registered their cameras. Please email CandleLakeCOPPS@gmail.com to obtain a camera registry form or pick one up at the RVCL Office.

Doug Fehr, President of the Saskatchewan Citizens On Patrol Association (SCOPA), and President of the North Battleford COPP manages a camera registry in North Battleford. "I know our RCMP detachment see value in [the camera registry] and I know of at least 3 circumstances where the camera footage aided in recovery of stolen property and/or helped prove who was at fault in a vehicle accident," says Doug.

As the Candle Lake Fun Run Community Rink located at the Community Grounds nears completion, Fun Run Inc. on December 16 representatives Brent and Joely Loehndorf presented RVCL Councillor Deb Hunter with a cheque for \$20,000 towards the acquisition and installation of the rink. Village crews are working hard to get the ice ready before Christmas so that everyone can enjoy it over the holiday season. December Council Meeting Highlights

THE FOLLOWING DECISIONS WERE MADE AT THE DECEMBER REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING:

- **RVCL Cemetery:** Council gave first reading to Bylaw 17-2024 Cemetery Bylaw which would replace the current Cemetery Policy to serve as a more comprehensive guide for cemetery operations. The Bylaw includes plans for additional plots plus a suitable area for a potential future columbarium. Final approval will be considered at the January Council Meeting.
- **RVCL Fees and Charges:** Cemetery Fees were amongst some of the changes proposed to the Fees and Charges Bylaw 20-24. Cemetery Fees will increase to closer reflect the cost of operation. In addition, the Building Permit Fee was moved to the Fees and Charges Bylaw from the Planning and Development Fee Bylaw and the Planning and Development Fee Bylaw was amended accordingly. Final approval to be considered at the January Council Meeting.
- **RVCL Charitable Receipt Policy:** Council added the Candle Lake Highway 55 North Search and Rescue group to the list of organizations in the Charitable Receipt Policy 200-08 for which the Village is able issue tax deductible receipts for designated donations made to the Village by individuals. Council also approved a license agreement permitting the group to store a utility trailer on the Community Grounds.
- **RVCL Janitorial Contracts:** Council awarded the Janitorial Contracts for the Community Hall and Village Administration Office and related properties. Administration recommended that one contract be renewed (with no changes) for a further two years and the other contract (resulting from a public tender) be awarded to the contractor currently providing the service.
- **2025 Council Meeting and Budget Meeting Dates:** Council approved the schedule of Regular Monthly Meetings of Council for 2025 and received a report outlining the 2025 Budget Process. A schedule of Budget Meetings was also approved. The goal is to approve the final 2025 Budget on March 27, 2025, at the March Regular Meeting of Council.
- **Holiday Hours:** A reminder that the RVCL municipal offices and Landfill will be closed over the holiday season from December 25 – January 1st. Wednesday waste collection will move to Tuesday for both weeks.
