To lead this vision, the Resort Village of Candle Lake (RVCL) is seeking a dedicated professional for a unique, evolving role.

THE OPPORTUNITY

This position begins with a project-based mandate and transitions into a permanent leadership role:

- **Phase 1:** Program Development – Build the “backbone” of the Volunteer Program, including safety infrastructure and operational systems.
- **Phase 2:** Implementation – Recruit and train volunteers to provide essential services like medical transportation and wellness checks.
- **Phase 3:** Long-term Leadership – Transition into a permanent, full-time role as the RVCL Executive Assistant and Office Manager, supporting municipal governance.



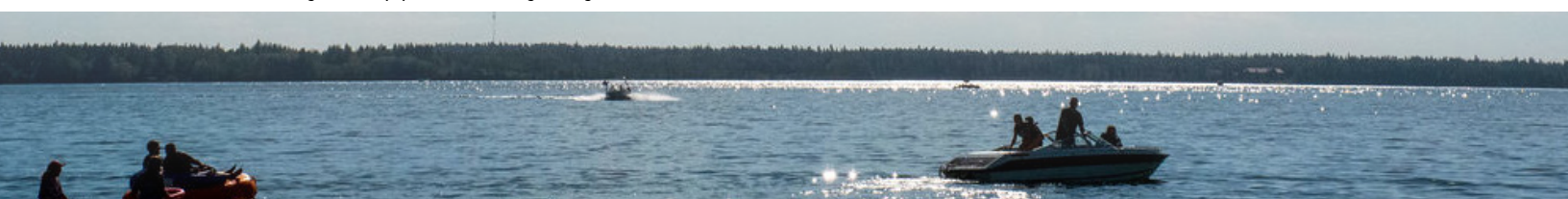

News from the Resort Village

Candle Lake Water Level Update

We've heard your concerns regarding spring runoff and lake levels. Here is the latest from the Water Security Agency (WSA) who is responsible for the operation and management of the water control structure.

Responsibility for water levels: The WSA manages the water control structure, not the Resort Village. The WSA recently upgraded the water control structure to an automated system that is continuously monitored and designed to maintain lake levels within parameters established by the WSA.

Current Plan: Levels are currently below normal due to last year's dry weather, so the WSA is not releasing water yet. They are confident the runoff can be managed and will reassess in mid-to-late June.

Expect higher levels overall: Due to this winter's heavy snow, lake levels are expected to be higher this summer than last year— this is good news for boating, our shoreline, and docks.

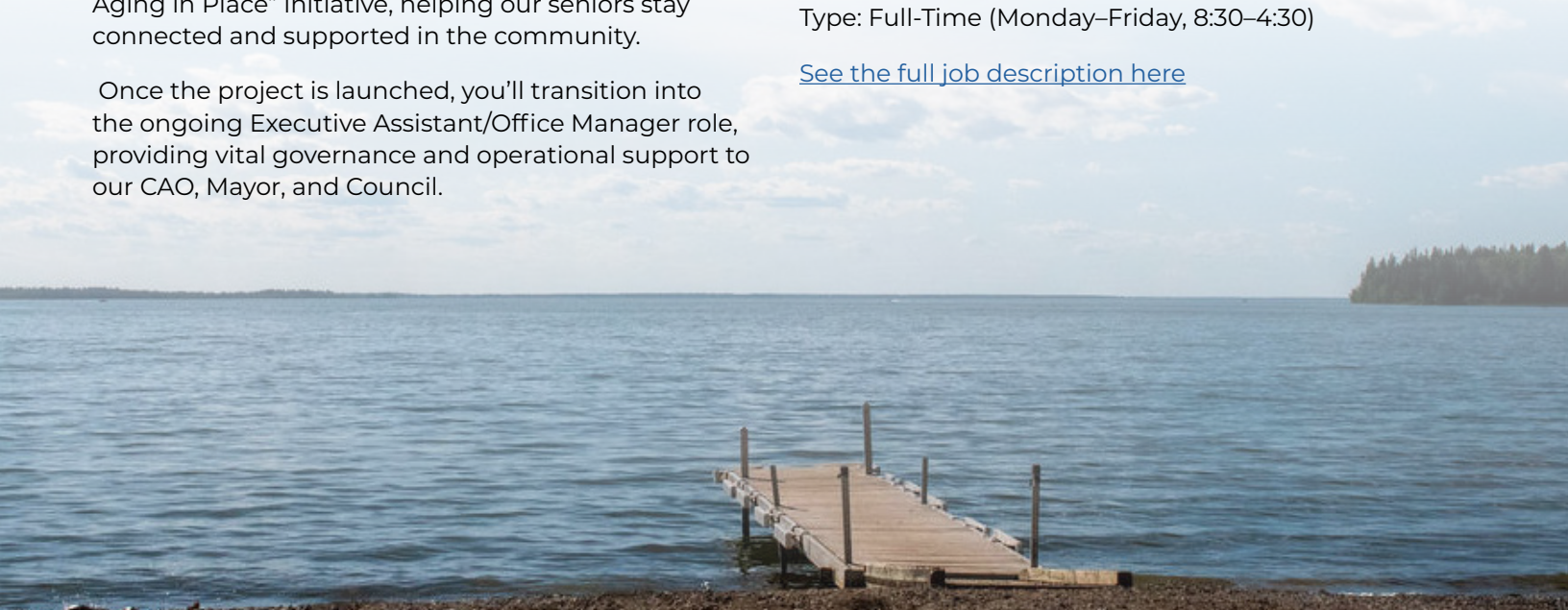

Did You Know? – Census Data Impacts Community Funding

Less than 25% of Candle Lake property owners currently list Candle Lake as their primary residence on the Census. If Candle Lake is where you usually live, make sure you list Candle Lake as your primary residence on your Census form. The Village currently receives about \$300,000 per year in Provincial Revenue Sharing. If every home in Candle Lake was occupied by a permanent resident, that funding could be over \$1.2 million per year.

Accurate census numbers help bring more funding to our community, which helps support services and keep taxes down. Be counted where you usually live.

Council Meeting Highlights

Homebased Discretionary Use Application – Council heard a presentation from J. Attig in support of his application to operate a Lawn Care business from his home at 40 Pine Crescent as well as a presentation from E. Jamen opposing the application raising concerns of impacts on the neighboring properties. Council tabled the matter until the May Council meeting to consider additional information.

Social Prescribing Agreement - Council authorized the Mayor to sign an agreement between the Sask. Seniors Mechanism extending funding for the Community Connector until December 31, 2027.

Commercial Land Sale - Council approved a motion to extend the term of the Conditional Offer from Jason Doell to Purchase approximately 4.07 acres of land for the proposed development of a commercial shopping centre until May 30, 2026 pending subdivision approval and review of the Land Sale Agreement.

Subdivision Application - Council endorsed an application from the Ministry of Environment to subdivide the Candlewood Cove Marina to include the lake access on the same parcel as the marina.

Community Risk Assessment – Council passed a resolution to execute the Project Charter Agreement with Forsite for the preparation of an application for funding from the Federation of Canadian Municipalities to produce a community risk assessment report for the RVCL which will qualify the municipality for future risk mitigation project funding.

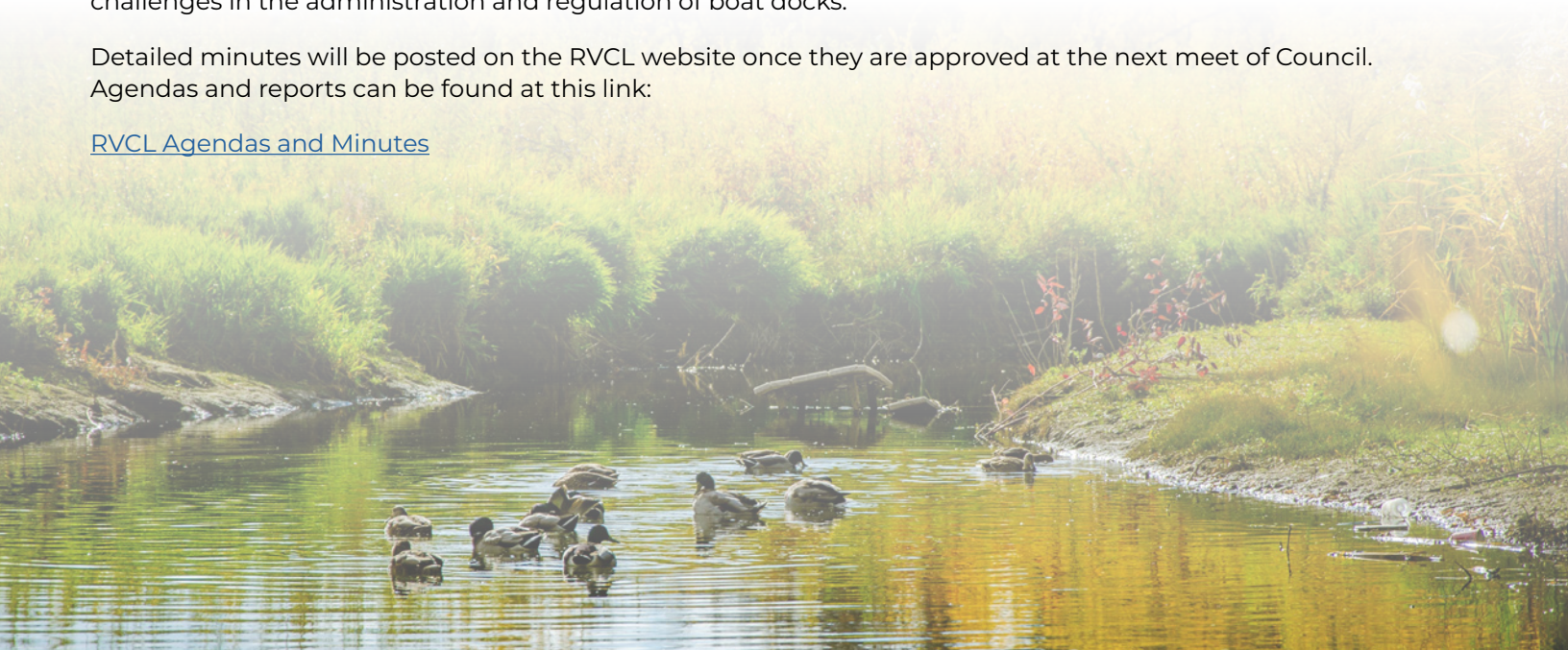
Snowmobile Registration Enforcement – Council received a report from Administration in response to public concerns raised over the RVCL Community Safety Officer enforcement practices. After review and consultation with the RCMP no changes were recommended.

Committee Bylaw Review - Council requested Administration to prepare draft amendments to the Advisory Committee Bylaws to allow Council to appoint a member who does not live in the municipality and to clarify the role of the Council representative on the committees.

Dock Permit Bylaw Review – Council directed Administration to conduct public consultation at the Welcome Back to the Lake event on proposed amendments to the Dock Permit Bylaw, aimed at addressing current challenges in the administration and regulation of boat docks.
