We were pleased to be part of the annual Welcome to the Lake event. It was nice to see that it could be held this year.

Ditch Pickin' 2022 was completed last week. Thanks to everyone who picked ditches as members of a club or organization or as individuals who believe in tidiness and community pride in our beautiful resort. Many people continue to pick during spring and into summer out on their hikes and walks. Your work makes a big impact on the visual and healthy appearance of our resort.

The floral baskets will arrive soon and beds will be planted in early June. A group of volunteers is ready to plant and care for the beds during the summer season, but we do need more help. The Sounds of Rushing Water

This was a different spring at Aschim this year. The snowshoe crowd had left packed trails across the swamp and on many of the boardwalks. On an early May sunlit day, we walked through some water, some packed snowshoe trails and exposed ground to get to the House and yard. The reason – we wanted to see the water flow. The West Creek was flowing and surging through the openings in the beaver dam. No beaver or blocked runs, just the sound of rushing water through the openings we had cut in the dam. What a gorgeous spring sound along with the smells of a swamp waking up from winter.

Some days later the West Creek could be enjoyed from the “Patio Bridge “on the southern boardwalk, the High Bridge on the service road, the bridge west of the House and of course from the lip of the beaver dam. Even some jackfish were observed.

From the 3 exploratory walks done so far, the “Aschim Homestead “wintered well. It is ready for the hiking season. Thanks to CiB volunteers the boardwalks, trails and Aschim yard/house will make a great spring hike – before the mosquitoes come out.

PS: Thanks to the dog owners who used the trails this winter, the containers along the trails contain many “little blue bags”. The trails are pristine.

With the busy summer season around the corner, Village staff are getting the community ready to showcase the beauty of our area. Thank you to all of our staff for their hard work!

The Resort Village is working to improve pedestrian safety. You may have noticed crews installing delineators and flashing crosswalk lights along Main Street. This was made possible through an SGI Traffic Safety Grant the Village received which will cover 100% of the project.

On the May long weekend, the Candle Lake Chamber of Commerce hosted a very successful "Welcome Back to the Lake" event. Thank you to all the groups and organizations that took part. It was a fantastic day!

Summer Hours are now in effect at the Landfill. The Landfill is open weekly on Monday, Tuesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 8:30 am – 4:00 pm and closed on Wednesday and Thursday. The Landfill is also closed daily for lunch from 12:00 – 12:30 pm. Recycling containers are available at the Landfill and at the Resort Village Community Grounds. A reminder to place only recyclable materials in the recycle containers and take the time to collapse cardboard boxes.

2022 Tax Notices will be mailed out to property owners in early June, and taxes are due by December 31st to avoid interest charges. Residents who pay their taxes before August 31st will receive a 5% discount on the municipal portion of your taxes.
