

News from the Trails Advisory Board





Feature Trail: Northview Trail

This is an easy-to-moderate nature trail for walking/hiking, snowshoeing, and mountain biking. The trail is 2.2 km one-way. There are uneven surfaces and some wet areas with boardwalks. While on this trail you will travel through an old-growth forest with diverse vegetation, from ferns to some of the oldest and largest trees in the area. This East-to-West trail connects Nobles Point subdivision to Northview and Golf Course subdivisions. The West trailhead is located at the north end of the Simon Lehne trail at Simon Lehne Drive and Earl Street - parking is available at Nobles Point. The East trailhead is located at Northview Drive and 5th Avenue - a parking lot is available at the East trailhead. Improvements were recently made to the Northview Trail. On July 23rd mulching to widen the trail for easier maintenance access was completed.

HANNA TURCOTTE



MITCHELL MINIER


Mitchell and his family have had a cabin at Candle Lake for 17 years. What he likes most about being here is the lake activities.

2024 Election Results

Residents of the Resort Village voted on Saturday, July 27 to elect our Mayor and Council. The Council that will lead our community over the next four years will include:

Mayor - Colleen Lavoie · Councillor - Jonathon Attig (re-elected) · Councillor - Debra Hunter (re-elected) Councillor - Hugh Garven · Councillor - Shelly Voykin

A total of 1,117 residents voted in the election. A breakdown of the results is as follows:

Candidates for Mayor:

Collen Lavoie - 795 · Joseph Barczia - 252 · Borden Wasyluk - 70

Candidates for Council:

Doug Allen - 389 · Jonathon Attig - 802 · Hugh Garven - 875 · Debra Hunter - 892 · Shelly Voykin – 766

The new Council will be officially sworn in on Thursday, August 1st at 5:30 pm.

July Council Meeting Highlights

- · Council approved a resolution authorizing the mayor and administrator sign and execute a service agreement for the approved subdivision of Legal Description NW 26 55-23 W 2 in North Sackett (Thurber Subdivision).
- · Council passed a motion to continue with enforcement to collect taxes outstanding from 2022 and 2023 from several property owners. The Tax Enforcement Act provides that Council may, by resolution, authorize proceedings for any title and it would be best practice to continue with proceedings against all properties to maintain an equal judgment for all owners with arrears.
- · Council received and agreed to sign an agreement provided by the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) to provide funding for the RVCL Landfill expansion.
- · The RVCL Communication Policy was adopted. The Resort Village of Candle Lake (RVCL) strives to provide open, honest communication with residents, businesses, employees, and visitors. Communication plays an integral role in the success of each RVCL Department. Internally, all RVCL employees engage in communication practices daily, whether one-on-one with residents/public, or with co-workers. The Communications Policy provides background information and guidelines for the various forms of communications practices that are, or should be, in place to ensure a high level of communications proficiency.
- The RVCL Out of Scope Human Resources Policy was adopted. The Policy outlines employment provisions for out of scope staff who are not covered by the CUPE Collective Bargaining Unit.
- · Council discussed a letter received from the Lakeland Fire Department terminating the existing Mutual Aid Agreement that is in place. The Resort Village would prefer to enter into a new mutual aid agreement with Lakeland Fire Department as response times to Aspen Ridge, Cranberry Creek and the Torch Light RV Park would be faster than what they could provide. A letter will be drafted and sent to the RM of Paddockwood asking them to consider and discuss this decision further with the Village.
- · The new Saskatchewan Evaluation App was endorsed by council. The app was developed by the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency to provide residents with a way to provide their community with necessary information required where an evacuation is necessary. The SPSA will be rolled out to Candle Lake residents soon. The public are encouraged to sign up for the App.
