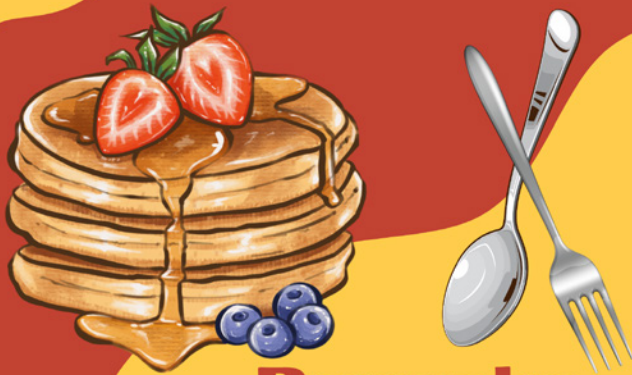

A registered nurse will assess your symptoms and help you decide whether to treat your own symptoms, go to a clinic, see your primary health care provider, or access emergency medical care, if necessary.

HealthLine 811 also provides mental health and addictions support. HealthLine's registered Psychiatric Nurses and Registered Social workers can offer crisis support, advice to help you manage your situation, and connections to resources in your community.

Neighbours Helping Neighbours

TURNING COMMUNITY CARING INTO ACTION

Last month, we introduced Volunteers Supporting Aging in Place, a new Candle Lake initiative built around a simple idea: sometimes a little help can make a very big difference.

Our vision is for Candle Lake to be a community where asking for a little help is easy, offering help is meaningful, and remaining independent doesn't mean having to do everything alone.

A ride to an appointment, help with a small household or seasonal task, a friendly visit, a wellness check-in, or assistance with technology may be all someone needs to continue living safely and confidently at home.

These aren't necessarily health-care problems. But left unresolved, small problems can become big ones. That is where community can make a difference.

Volunteers Supporting Aging in Place will connect any resident who need a little assistance with community volunteers willing to help. The goal is not to replace families, health-care providers or existing services, but to fill some of the gaps that inevitably exist in a small rural community and strengthen the network of support that helps people remain independent.

One volunteer. One neighbour. One small act. But potentially a very significant difference.

FROM PLANNING TO ACTION

The project is now moving forward. We have engaged consultants for Program Development and Community Coordination, and the structure needed to put the program into action is being created.

The Program Developer is establishing the foundation for a safe and dependable program, including policies and procedures, volunteer screening and training, service guidelines, safety practices, and ways to evaluate our success. Our Community Coordinator will provide the important local connection—helping identify needs, recruit and support volunteers, and turn the program structure into practical services for Candle Lake residents.

This work will complement our Community Connector, Amy Wingate, who is already helping residents identify needs and connect with available resources.

We are building more than a collection of volunteer services. We are creating a coordinated community support system designed around the needs of the people who live here, not only the elderly. The benefits reach beyond those receiving assistance.

Community support can reduce isolation, provide relief for caregivers, help identify changing needs earlier,

and give volunteers meaningful opportunities to contribute.

Some of us will need help. Some of us will be able to provide it. Over the course of our lives, many of us will experience both. That is what neighbours helping neighbours really means.

WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU

What small supports would make it easier for you, a family member, friend or neighbour to continue living independently at Candle Lake? Could you occasionally offer an hour of your time or share a skill with a neighbour?

Emergency Preparedness

KNOW YOUR MUSTER POINT: STAY SAFE AT CANDLE LAKE

A Muster Point is a safe, designated, pre-arranged meeting place outside a building, worksite, or community gathering area. During an emergency, employees, residents, and visitors can gather at the Muster Point to stay safely away from danger. It also allows emergency personnel to conduct a headcount, confirm that everyone is safe, and provide rescue teams, emergency responders and community with important information.

WHERE IS THE MUSTER POINT?

The Resort Village of Candle Lake Muster Point is located in the Community Hall area.

In the event of an emergency, look for the green and white Muster Point sign, which will direct you to the designated meeting location.

WHY DOES A MUSTER POINT MATTER?

- **Safety:** A Muster Point moves people away from hazards and keeps them clear of emergency vehicles and response areas.
 - **Headcount:** Roll calls can be conducted to determine whether everyone is accounted for.
 - **Rescue Efforts:** If someone is missing, emergency responders can be informed that the person may still be in danger or require assistance.
 - **Less Panic:** Knowing where to go during an emergency helps reduce confusion and keeps everyone focused on staying safe.
 - **Communication:** Gathering in one designated location makes it easier to share important information and updates with the community.
- Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the Muster Point location before an emergency occurs. Knowing where to go can make a significant difference when every second matters.

Important Safety Reminders for ATV & Golf Cart Use

We have received several concerns from residents regarding the use of ATVs, quads, side-by-sides, dirt bikes, and golf carts within the Village. These concerns have been shared with our Community Safety Officers.

Please review these key regulations from ATV Bylaw No. 13 of 2021, Vehicle Bylaw 14 of 2021, and Golf Cart Bylaw No. 06-2023:

ATV & DIRT BIKE REGULATIONS

- Ages 16+: Must hold a valid driver's license.
- Ages 12-15: May only operate if they have completed an approved Highway Traffic Board ATV safety course or, they must remain under constant visual or verbal supervision by an adult with a valid driver's license.
- Speed & Signs: Maximum speed is 40 km/h on municipal roads (or lower where posted). Drivers must obey all posted traffic signs and general rules of the road.
- Safety & Conduct: Approved helmets must be worn at all times by both operators and passengers. Operators must completely refrain from stunt driving or creating unreasonable noise.
- Registration: All ATVs must be registered with the Resort Village and display a valid permit.
- Prohibited Areas: Operation is strictly forbidden on Provincial Highways #265 and #120 (except to cross), public beaches, parks, green spaces, ski trails, and designated walking or biking paths.

GOLF CART REGULATIONS

- Licensing: Operators must hold at least a valid Class 5 driver's licence.
- Where to Drive: Carts may only be driven on municipal roads with a posted speed limit of 40 km/h or less.
- Registration: Carts must be registered with the Resort Village of Candle Lake Office and display a valid permit.
- Prohibited Areas: Driving is forbidden on Provincial Highways #265 and #120 (except to cross), designated walking trails, ski trails, public beaches, parks, or green spaces.

REPORT CONCERNS & READ FULL BYLAWS

Let's keep safety first and foremost. If you observe unsafe vehicle operation or wish to report excessive noise, please contact our Community Safety Officers at 1-306-960-1855.

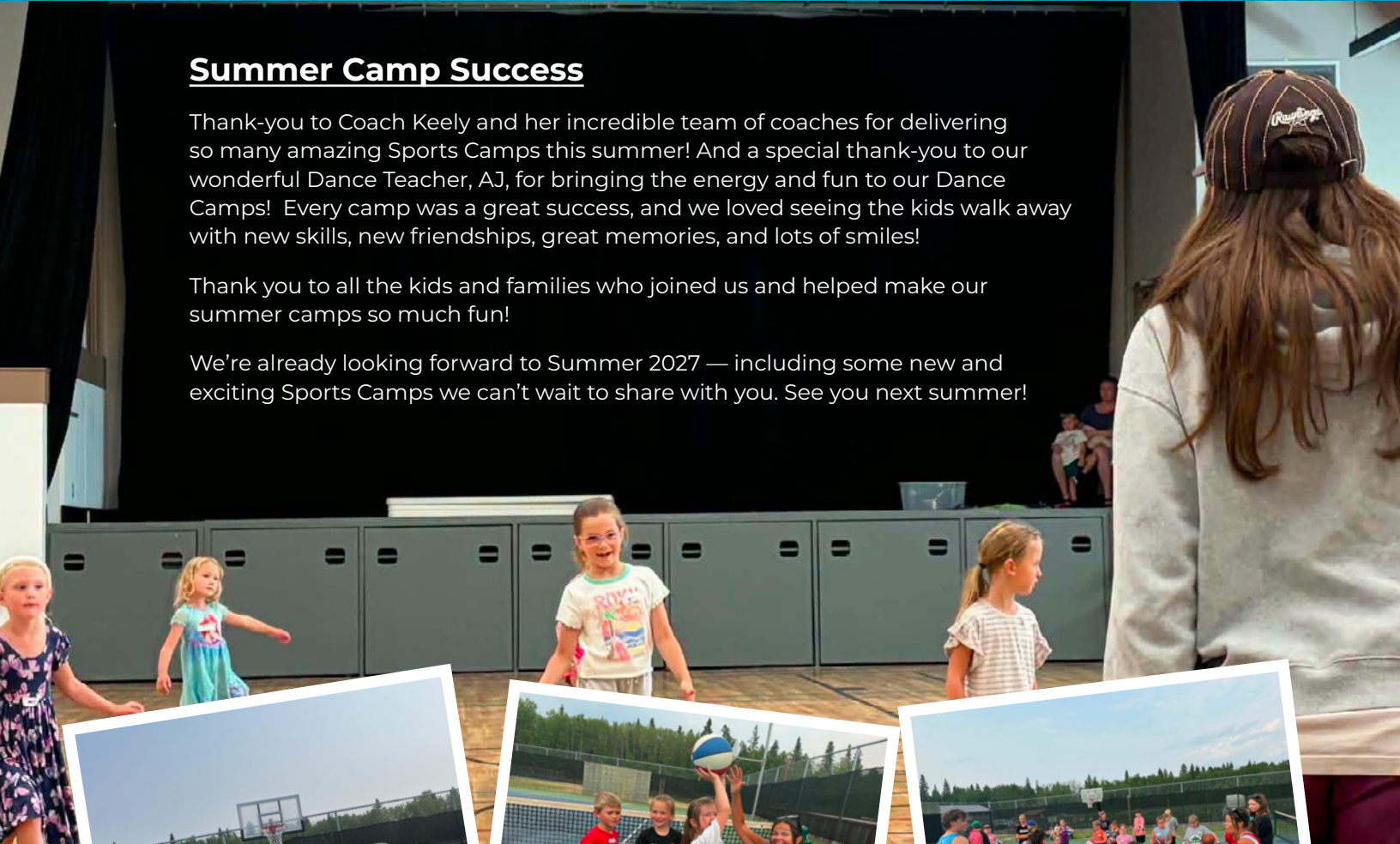

August 2026 Council Meeting Highlights

Fairway Views Subdivision – A delegation representing the property owners in the neighborhood along Rumberger Road presented a proposal for the naming of the subdivision. Marc Ritchie explained the neighbourhood was never officially named and after a survey of the residents they had overwhelming support for the proposed name Fairway Views. Council referred the matter to Administration to review and report back to Council.

Vendors Permit – Council approved a temporary vender permit for Velda Court operating as Gators Grub Food Truck to operate on the parking lot on Depeel Street near Waskateena Beach until September 7, 2026 while council continue to look at options to permit vendors to operate in the Village near the public beach.

Simon Lehne Walking Trail – Council received a report concerning approval of an SGI Safety Grant for \$50,000 to extend the Simon Lehne walking path. This was 50% of the total requested in the application. Council approved the tendering of the portion of the trail from Main Street to Holiday Drive. Completion of the remaining section of the trail from White Pine Place to Ford Road in 2026 or deferral to 2027 will depend on the budgeted funds remaining.

Property Taxes – Council approved a resolution to commence tax enforcement proceedings on properties with outstanding taxes for 2025. 2026 property taxes will have penalties applied monthly on unpaid balances as of August 31, 2026. Consider signing up for the Tax Installment Plan Program TIPPS to avoid penalties.

Volunteer Coordinator – Council approved a professional services contract with Pam Stach for Volunteer Coordinator services. Pam will support the Health Services Board's Volunteers Supporting Aging in Place initiative as well as the Lakelife volunteer program.

Spruce Grove Subdivision Service Agreement – Council approved an amendment to the service agreement between the RVCL and Whitford Construction to extend the completion of construction to December 31, 2026.
