News from the Resort Village of Candle Lake

THANK YOU!

Words cannot express our sincere gratitude to all the groups and individuals who played a role in keeping our community safe during the recent fire threat to Candle Lake. Their tireless work and coordinated efforts helped to safeguard our community, and this will never be forgotten.

OUR FIRE CHIEF & LOCAL VOLUNTEERS

- Fire Chief Jim Arnold and the firefighters, first responders, and Community Safety Officers who make up Candle Lake Emergency Services provided fire fighting and security expertise for long hours every single day of this incident.
- Members of the Candle Lake Emergency Operations Centre met daily, and sometimes more, to manage all aspects of our community response and communicate information to the public on tight timelines.
- Members of Candle Lake Emergency Social Services volunteers ensured food and accommodation were provided and went door-to-door to ensure the health and safety of every single person in our community.
- Our local COPPs members and Conservation Officers helped to provide additional security on a 24/7 basis to keep our properties safe.

OUTSIDE AGENCIES

- The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency provided resources including firefighting and equipment resources from within Canada and the United States.
- Wildfire Defense Systems, the Search and Rescue Saskatchewan Association of Volunteers and dozens of local volunteers all worked quickly to FireSmart nearly every single property in our community and area, for people they didn't even know.
- GlobalMedic provided the Resort Village with a gift of four Skid Units to help our firefighters extinguish dangerous spot fires. Fire Chief Mike Kwasnica of Humboldt, President of the Saskatchewan Association of Fire Chiefs (SAFC) and Joanne Austin, SAFC Executive Director spearheaded the request to GlobalMedic.
- Saskatchewan Parks (Candle Lake) staff for finding a place for over 200 firefighters to stay last minute when Lower Fishing Lake was evacuated.

MAYOR & COUNCIL

• Our Mayor and Council provided overall oversight of the crisis and went above and beyond by taking the time to meet with community members, especially those most vulnerable, to ensure everyone was ok.



News from the Health Services Committee

COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS - CREATING A COMMUNITY INSPIRED APPROACH TO ADVANCE HEALTH SERVICES IN CANDLE LAKE

In late March 2025, the Health Service Committee hosted three community consultations where 50 community members shared their thoughts and insights into how we can help advance health services in our community. Thank you to everyone who participated, for caring, and giving of your time!

The sessions specifically focused on health needs and resources in our community in three areas:

- · Transportation Assistance locally and out of community
- · System Navigation Finding resources and information
- · In Home Support Assistance when required in life crisis points or to "age in place"

We identified the strengths, weaknesses, the threats and the opportunities in each of these areas, gathered very interesting ideas, and identified common issues surrounding each.



This information will now be used to set priorities for the work of the Health Services Committee as we strive to address the needs of all of our residents. Our final report will be released in early June and will be posted on the RVCL website under Health Services page. Watch the RVCL Facebook - and we will post it online at Candle Lake Health Services.

Our next steps will be to address the common issues identified surrounding:

- · Varied communication strategies;
- · Volunteer structure, recruitment, support and coordination;
- · Creating a resource directory Listing our resources both local and elsewhere; and
- · Exploring and implementing funding strategies.

FEATURE TRAIL: OLD HORSE TRAIL (3.1 KM ONE-WAY)

This historical trail has moderate terrain that can accommodate walkers/hikers, mountain biking, and snowshoeing in the winter. This trail has signage created by Communities in Bloom which provides historical info as well as artifacts from the past. While on the trail you may experience ruts and exposed spruce or aspen tree roots and at times the trail narrows. To access the trail, find the trailhead at the corner of Industrial Road & Main Steet. The trail ends at a registered snowmobile trail (at the South end of Bay Lake); please do not enter the snowmobile trail. A reminder that ATVs are not allowed on trails.

News from Citizens on Patrol COPPS

WHAT DOES COPPS DO?

COPPS patrols watch for suspicious activity in neighbourhoods throughout our community at all times of the day and night. Our reflective shields are always placed on both sides of our vehicles. If you see any suspicious activity, please call the community dispatcher at (306) 960-1855.



HIGHER FREQUENCY OF BREAK-INS IN THE SPRING

The RCMP have informed COPPS that in the spring, there is typically a higher-than-normal frequency of breakins due to property owners 're-stocking' their seasonal residences for the summer. Please keep an eye on your and your neighbours' properties, watching for suspicious activity and ALWAYS report suspicious activity to the Community Dispatch at (306) 960-1855. Even if a break-in has not occurred, reporting suspicious activity alerts law enforcement officers to potential issues and gives them a better idea of what to watch for in our community.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERA REGISTRY

Property owners with surveillance cameras are encouraged to register their address with our 'Surveillance Camera Registry.' The registry is an investigative tool to assist our Candle Lake Community Safety Officers (CSO's) and the RCMP with investigations when incidents occur in your neighbourhood. You can help protect your community by registering your security camera(s) with the Candle Lake COPPS. Your contact information and the camera location information will ONLY be shared with the Candle Lake CSO's and the RCMP. If required, investigators will contact you directly and request permission for surveillance footage for specific periods of time. It is at your discretion to release the video footage to the CSO's and/or RCMP.



Candle Lake COPPS Camera Registry forms are available at local businesses, at the RVCL Office or by emailing CandleLakeCOPPS@gmail.com.

Doug Fehr, President of the Saskatchewan Citizens On Patrol Association (SCOPA), and President of the North Battleford COPP manages a camera registry in North Battleford. This is what he has this to say about their camera registry: "I know our RCMP detachment see value in [the camera registry] and I know of at least 3 circumstances where the camera footage aided in recovery of stolen property and/or helped prove who was at fault in a vehicle accident."

News from the Resort Village

Van Impe Neighbourhood First in Saskatchewan to practice FireSmart!

Earlier this year, the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency invited communities in Saskatchewan to apply for a grant to be used in conjunction with FireSmart planning in individual neighbourhoods. Three Candle Lake neighbourhoods were grant recipients, and in May, the Van Imp neighbourhood became the first neighbourhood in the province to hold a FireSmart initiative meeting. Representatives of the SPSA and Candle Lake Emergency Services were in attendance of the event.

FireSmart is focused on taking proactive steps to ensure areas around properties are clear of any excess fuel that could easily burn.

Creating Fairness and Sustainability in Lagoon Usage

Over the past decade the Resort Village lagoon system has encountered capacity issues, especially in the busy peak season. This has been caused by growth in both our seasonal population and in the number of commercial haulers from outside the Resort Village that transport sewage to the lagoon. An expansion project is currently underway at the East Lagoon to address these capacity issues.

Historically, lagoon operating costs have been funded through general taxation, which has resulted in property owners with higher assessed property values paying more for lagoon use, regardless of their usage. In addition, septic companies disposing of sewage on behalf of property owners located within the Resort Village do not pay a lagoon disposal fee; the fees property owners pay to commercial haulers cover only transportation.

As Candle Lake properties are unmetered, it is not possible to create a volume-based fee system, therefore a flat annual levy is the most practical and equitable for local users.

At the May meeting of Council, a Bylaw to create a Lagoon Waste Management Rate was approved. It changes the way lagoon operations are funded and includes the following:

- · A \$100 flat levy on every improved property to cover fixed overhead costs; and
- · A \$0.045/gal fee to be remitted by approved commercial haulers for sewage originating outside the RVCL.

This bylaw establishes fair and sustainable rates for the use of the municipal sewage lagoon by both owners of properties located within the Resort Village, not including vacant lots, and commercial sewage haulers who service properties outside the Resort Village.

The revenue collected from the levy and fee will cover the lagoon operating and maintenance costs and allow for a contribution to our capital reserves.





Is Your Address Visible From the Street? Help Us Help You!

In accordance with Candle Lake Emergency Services Bylaw 07-2025, Section 29, all buildings, RV trailers, mobile homes, and other structures must have their civic address number clearly displayed and visible from the street.

Lettering must be not less than 100 mm high with a 25 mm stroke. This initiative is essential to help First Responders locate properties quickly during emergencies, ensuring fast and effective assistance when it's needed most.

The deadline for voluntary compliance is June 30. After June 30, 2025, enforcement will begin. Properties without visible civic addressing may be subject to a \$250 fine under the bylaw.

Highlights from the May Executive Committee and Council Meeting

Sale of Municipal Land Proposal – Council considered a proposal received last month for the sale of Municipal Reserve lands on behalf of some cabin owners in the Onechassa Subdivision and determined the proposal did not comply with the RVCL Municipal Lands Policy 200-71 in that it fails to show any measurable benefits to the municipality and directed administration to advise the applicant.

2024 Audited Financial Statement - The 2024 Audited Financial Statement was presented by Landon Grubb of BDO Financial Accounting and Council approved the audited financial statements at the May Council meeting. The Financial Statement is available on our website HERE.

Emergency Services Fire Prevention Bylaw - Council amended the bylaw to simplify the enforcement process by allow enforcement officers to issue fines which offer an opportunity for the offender to pay it without going to court over the matter.

Public Behavior Bylaw – Council approved an amendment to the bylaw to clarify that it is an offence to interfere with an employee or agent of the village in the commission of their duties.

Candle Lake Community in Bloom (CIB) Memorandums of Understanding- Council renewed their agreement CIB for maintenance services for the Aschim Heritage Site and the beautification and recycling initiatives within the Village. The MOU was also amended it so that it will renew automatically each year unless the parties desire changes.

Subdivision Application – Council endorsed an application to subdivide a residential lot at 3 White Poplar Crescent into two parcels. The subdivision will reverse a previous consolidation of the two parcels.

Bobcat E60 Mini Excavator – Council approved an increase in funding of \$6,420 to cover the P.S.T. to purchase a new Mini Excavator which was budgeted for in the 2025 budget to replace the existing 2009 mini excavator. The funding will come from unanticipated revenue in the operating budget resulting from the sale of surplus equipment.
