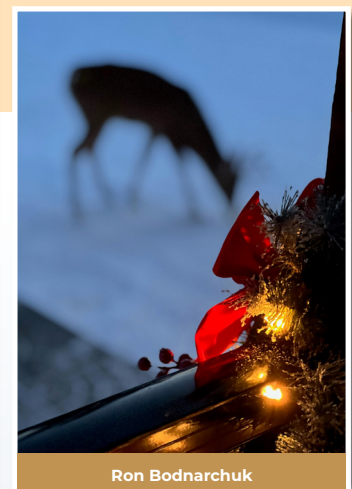
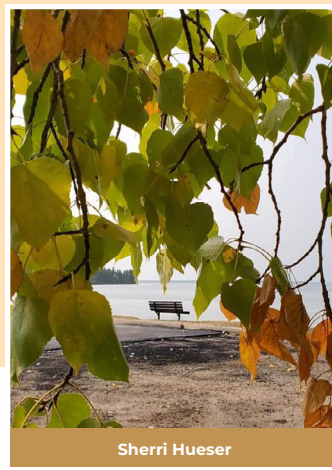
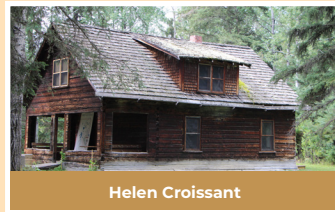

News from the Trails Advisory Board

Feature Trail: Old Horse Trail (3.1 km one-way)

This historical trail has moderate terrain that can accommodate walkers/hikers, mountain biking, and snowshoeing in the winter. This trail has signage created by Communities in Bloom which provides historical info as well as artifacts from the past. While on the trail you may experience ruts and exposed spruce or aspen tree roots and at times the trail narrows.

To access the trail, find the trailhead at the corner of Industrial Road & Main Street. The trail ends at a registered snowmobile trail (at the South end of Bay Lake); please do not enter the snowmobile trail. A reminder that ATVs are not allowed on trails.

Four Candle Lake Health Services committee members, the Mayor and our Resort Village of Candle Lake Administrative representative were invited to attend the Health Quality Council's **Thrive at Home Workshop: Re-Envisioning Community Supports for Older Adults** held in Saskatoon on April 29th.

The aim of the conference was to strengthen and improve community-based care and services that enable older adults to "thrive at home" and age where they choose. It seems many people choose Candle Lake to do just that. Our intent is to find ways to assist our community to provide new local services and continue to care for each other.

We presented our initiative, "Candle Lake Alive and Well" and joined in discussions with Saskatchewan people representing the Saskatchewan Health Authority, provincial service agencies, service providers and seniors. 2024 Election News

The Resort Village of Candle Lake Municipal Election will be held Saturday, July 27, 2024. Nomination packages and requests for mail in ballots are now available at the Resort Village Office. Updates to Election 2024 information will be provided on the Resort Village website under Resort Village Office or by clicking on this link: [Resort Village of Candle Lake 2024 Election](#).

- **Electing Mayor and 4 Councillors:** Starting May 15, 2024, candidates can pick up the Nomination Paper, Candidates Acceptance, Municipal Public Disclosure Statement at the Village office and must submit a Criminal Record Check.
- **Call for Nominations:** Starting Friday, June 7, 2024, nominations will be accepted at the Village Office during business hours.
- **Closing of Nominations:** Must be received on or before Saturday, June 22, 2024 at the Village Office. (The Village office will be open from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on June 22nd for any last-day nomination submissions.)
- **Advance Poll:** Friday, July 19, 2024 and Saturday, July 20, 2024 from 10 am to 3 pm at the Community Hall.



• **Election Day:** Saturday July 27, 2024 from 8 am to 9 pm at the Community Hall.

• **Candidate Eligibility:** As per The Local Government Elections Act, 2015:

- o Candidates must be at least 18 years old on election day.
- o Candidates must not be disqualified by any Act.
- o Candidates must be Canadian citizens upon submitting the nomination paper.
- o For resort village elections in Saskatchewan:
 - Candidates must have resided in the resort village or on its land for at least three consecutive months prior to submitting the nomination paper.
 - Alternatively, candidates may qualify if they are the assessed person for property within the resort village for at least three consecutive months prior to nomination, or they are the spouse of such a person.

• **Voter Eligibility:** As per The Local Government Elections Act, 2015:

- o Eligible voters must be Canadian citizens.
- o Eligible voters must be at least 18 years old.
- o For resort village elections:
 - Eligible voters must have resided in the resort village or its land for at least three consecutive months preceding the election day.
 - Alternatively, eligible voters may qualify if they are the assessed person for property within the resort village for at least three consecutive months prior to election day, or they are the spouse of such a person.

• **Voter Identification:** As per The Local Government Regulations, 2015 Section 14 Appendix D:

- o There will be no voters list; instead, voters must provide identification and proof of residency.
- o Acceptable forms of identification include birth certificates, driver's licenses, passports, and health cards.
- o Acceptable property verification includes assessment notices, tax notices, power bills, energy bills, etc.

• **Mail-in Ballots:** Residents can request a mail-in ballot kit, including an Application & Declaration, from the Village office or by filling out and submitting the request form available on our website.

- o Great option for individuals over 65, those with health issues, or those unable to vote in person.
- o Once nominations close, ballots will be printed and a kit will be sent with instructions for mailing back.
- o Mail-in submissions must be received at the Village office before election day.

JULY 1ST (CANADA DAY) PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Everyone is getting excited for our Canada Day fireworks! Transport Canada has strict regulations in place for the transportation of fireworks (explosives); transport must be from a secure area to a secure launch site. Therefore, the lower half of the parking lot on Depeel Avenue will be closed starting at 7:00 am on July 1 until after the fireworks have been completed. This action will also ensure we are in compliance with Natural Resources Canada requirements for fireworks, and finally will help ensure public safety. Candle Lake Emergency Services thanks you for your understanding and cooperation.



OUR SUMMER STUDENTS ARE ARRIVING!

Our crew of summer students is rolling in! Carter and Kendra are all set to serve our residents this summer. They can't wait to get started using our new Kubota mower, fresh off the delivery truck from Prince Albert Glenmor Equipment. This mower is an addition to our current fleet and will enable us to increase our frequency and level of service.

ENHANCING EMERGENCY SERVICES IN OUR COMMUNITY

On May 14 Candle Lake Emergency Services personnel participated in Values Protection Training. The training took place at the Golf Resort and was provided by our partners in fire suppression are the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency. This training covers how to set up protection for cabins and/or trailers well in advance of a forest fire approaching our community. It includes how to set up a system with four pumps supplying water in a closed loop to ensure pressure stays constant throughout the system. This system will provide protection to areas with cabins or trailers through a continuous water supply that will increase the relative humidity around the structures that we are trying to protect. Once we receive the values protection equipment we have purchased we will be able to practice this training on our own. This training is an ongoing effort by Candle Lake Emergency Services to enhance the emergency services provided to our community.



USE CAUTION WITH OPEN FIRES

Resort Village Emergency Services is reminding residents and visitors to take care with open fires. Due to ongoing high fire hazard conditions, the Resort Village is monitoring conditions carefully to ensure safety for all. Monitoring is done through the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency. SAFETY/FIRE INSPECTIONS UNDERWAY

Safety/fire inspections have begun in the RV parks within the Resort Village. These inspections are being completed by the Fire Chief and the Resort Village Development Officer. The inspections look to ensure there is proper emergency access, that numbers are visible on each RV unit, and various safety hazards.

Ongoing safety/fire inspections within the RV parks within the Resort Village have found instances where refrigerators have been abandoned within RV sites. This is an issue throughout the Resort Village. This is extremely dangerous to curious children. The Abandoned Refrigerator Act requires that all refrigerators and freezers that have been abandoned outside ('abandoned' meaning there is no one at the property) must have their doors removed or must be locked at all times when there is no one on your property.
