COPPS INTRODUCES SURVEILLANCE CAMERA REGISTRY

The Candle Lake Citizens on Patrol Program (COPP) Annual General Meeting is scheduled for 7:00 to 8:00 pm on March 10th at the Candle Lake Curling Club lobby. The meeting is open to the public, but only registered Candle Lake COPPS members are eligible to vote. Volunteer application forms will be available at the meeting.

There were several 'car hopping's' reported between Christmas and New Year's, but things appear to be relatively quiet since that time. However, our patrols have identified suspicious vehicles that have been reported to the Community Safety Officers (CSO's). COPPS encourages all citizens to remain vigilant, don't leave items of value in your vehicles or in plain sight, and report any suspicious activity to the community dispatch service by calling 306-960-1855.

In a continued effort to keep our community safe Candle Lake COPPS have initiated a 'Surveillance Camera Registry.' The registry is an investigative tool to assist our Candle Lake Community Safety Officers and the RCMP with investigations when incidents occur in your neighbourhood. You can help protect your community by registering your security camera(s) with the Candle Lake COPPS.

When you register your security camera(s) with the Candle Lake COPPS your contact information and the camera location information will ONLY be shared with the Candle Lake CSO's and the RCMP. **No video footage will be shared with Candle Lake COPPS.** The investigators will contact you directly and request permission for surveillance footage for specific periods of time. It is at your discretion to release the video footage to the CSO's and/or RCMP.

News from the **Resort Village**

Saskatchewan's Brightest Light: Keeping Our Citizens Safe

Community safety is a vital component of quality of life. It enables law-abiding citizens to go about their daily lives without fear of violence, theft, or victimization from other criminal activities. One of the top priorities of the Resort Village is for people to feel safe where they live, work or spend their leisure time. Furthermore, public safety plays a critical role in emergency management, ensuring effective response and mitigation of natural disasters, pandemics, and other crises.

Policing services in the Resort Village of Candle Lake are provided by the Candle Lake Regional Special Constable Service and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. The Candle Lake Citizens on Patrol Program (COPPS), led by a group of residents, also operates within the Resort Village.

CANDLE LAKE REGIONAL SPECIAL CONSTABLE SERVICE

Candle Lake is fortunate to have three Special Constables (also known as Community Safety Officers or CSO's); two full-time and one part time, and one reserve constable. Special Constables are appointed and sworn into their positions according to The Police Act of Saskatchewan, 1990. They are responsible for applying legislation under Municipal, Provincial and Federal Law and work hand in hand with our enforcement partners including Candle Lake Emergency Services, Candle Lake COPPs, Smeaton RCMP, Saskatchewan Ministry of Environment Conservation Officers, and Saskatchewan Highway Patrol to promote public safety.

Our Special Constables respond to complaints made by the public regarding different types of situations from zoning and property standards, complaints about erratic driving and speeding, to animal control and alcohol and noise related complaints. Officers patrol as a crime reduction strategy and to provide a community policing presence. They also attend to public safety incidents to assist our partners. Candle Lake Special Constables are also responsible for enforcing bylaws within Candle Lake.

Bylaws are created by Council to govern the Resort Village. When it comes to bylaw enforcement, the Constable's main priority is to help solve compliance issues.

In 2023, the Special Constables responded to almost 500 calls. Many of these calls were to assist the RCMP, to provide residents with general assistance with issues, and traffic complaints. They also dealt with 375 separate situations related to bylaws and other matters. In addition, they conducted over 450 proactive patrols throughout the Resort Village area. The team currently uses three patrol vehicles which include a 2020 Chevrolet Tahoe, 2022 Chevrolet Traverse and a 2011 Dodge Charger.

When to Call a Special Constable

The Candle Lake Special Constables can be contacted with any questions or concerns residents have in relation to any laws or regulations in Candle Lake. Some examples of the most common type of calls received are in relation to (but not limited to):

- Noise complaints
- Traffic complaints
- Suspicious vehicle or person complaints
- Public use of liquor and cannabis
- Public drunkenness and public disturbances
- By-law enforcement in relation to messy yards or business licensing and dock concerns
- Animal control
- ATV complaints
- Trespassing
- Wildlife complaints

How to Contact a Special Constable

Please call the community dispatch service at 1-306-960-1855. The dispatcher will ask the type of complaint, the location of the complaint and information regarding the incident. If the situation is an emergency, it will be forwarded immediately to the Constable, or to the RCMP if the complaint falls outside of their mandate. If the situation is not an emergency, a Constable will attempt to contact the complainant within 72 hours.

How you can get involved - COPPS

Residents can also get involved in helping to improve the safety in our community. The Candle Lake Citizens on Patrol Program (COPPS) is made up of a group of volunteers who assist the Special Constables and the Smeaton RCMP in keeping our community and area safe. Our volunteers are anonymous; they patrol the Resort Village at all hours of the day or night, looking for signs of criminal activity and reporting suspicious matters as required.

The group recently initiated a Surveillance Camera Registry which is an investigative tool that will assist the Special Constables and the RCMP with investigations. By registering your security camera(s) with COPPS, you share your camera location information. Should an incident occur in the area, investigators may contact you to request permission to see the footage. Camera Registry forms are available at businesses throughout the community or by emailing CandleLakeCOPPSCameraRegistry@gmail.com.

VALUE OF 2023 CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS OVER \$9.5 MILLION

Did you know? In 2023, 74 building permits were issued in the Resort Village. The construction value of these permits was over \$9.5 million which will result in an estimated \$40,000 in additional annual tax revenue for the Village (based on 2023 tax rate).

A breakdown of the permits was as follows:

- 22 – Principal Dwellings
- 25 – Accessory Buildings
- 27 – Additions/Renovations

Over the last 15 years, the average number of building permits issued each year is 89, and over the last 5 years, the value of construction for all permits issued was \$47,362,480. This has resulted in an estimated \$200,000 in additional tax revenue for the Resort Village (based on the 2023 tax rate).

COMMUNITY HALL RENOVATIONS PROGRESSING THANKS TO GRANT OF OVER \$900,000

NEW UHP FIREFIGHTING SYSTEM FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES

Introducing the newest addition to Candle Lake Emergency Services! This 2018 Chevrolet half-ton with up-graded suspension has an Ultra High Pressure (UHP) firefighting system on board that can be deployed in the event of any type of fire. It carries 150 gallons of water and 10 gallons of firefighting foam. The system uses the water and foam to suppress fire in a unique way by converting water into very small droplets which evaporate quicker for maximum cooling effect. Our Fire Department will use this system to respond in combination with a fire engine and other apparatus to all fires in our response area. PLANNING FOR FUTURE SATELLITE FIRE STATION

At the December Council meeting, the Resort Village was directed to engage with the province regarding the terms to purchase land to house a future fire station in the Resort Village. This mid-term project was identified in the Candle Lake 10 Year Emergency Services Master Plan to enhance fire protection services throughout the entire Resort Village. SASK LOTTERIES COMMUNITY GRANT FUNDING AVAILABLE

Each year the Resort Village participates in the Saskatchewan Lotteries Community Grant Program to help volunteer, non-profit, and community organizations develop sport, culture and recreation opportunities within the community. The Program helps organizations offer opportunities that meet the unique needs of the local public. Examples of previous opportunities at Candle Lake approved for the Program include swimming lessons, library program supplies, dance lessons, pickleball equipment, basketball camp equipment, etc.

Organizations can apply for funding by submitting an application online at <https://candlelake.ca/p/saskatchewan-lotteries-community-grant>. Applications are accepted year-round. Once received, applications are reviewed for eligibility by the Manager or Recreation and Community Development, as well as members of the Sport, Culture and Recreation Board. Please review the Project Guidelines below to see if your program is eligible for funding.

PROJECT GUIDELINES

Eligible Programs

- Provide access to sport, culture or recreation activities; and
- For all people of Candle Lake.

Criteria for Expenditures

- Directly relate to the delivery of sport, culture or recreation project;
- Occur within the grant period of April 1 to March 31;
- Must publicly acknowledge Sask Lotteries within their activities; and

- Priority given to initiatives that are aimed at increasing participation in any under-represented population (seniors, economically disadvantaged, persons with a disability, single parent families, Indigenous people, women, new Canadians, etc.).

Ineligible Expenditures:

- Construction, renovations, retro-fit and repairs to buildings/facilities;
- Property taxes, insurance;
- Alcoholic beverages;
- Per Diems/Day Money;

- Food or food related costs;
- Membership fees in other lottery-funded organizations;
- Prizes, cash, gifts, awards, honorariums, trophies, plaques and badges;
- Out-of-province activities and travel;
- Donations;
- Subsidization of wages for full-time employees;
- Uniforms or personal items such as sweatbands, hats, etc.; and
- Other expenses that the Sask Lotteries Trust Fund may deem inappropriate.
