News from the Parks and Recreation Board 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

Last year was a very busy year for the Parks and Recreation Board as we worked to achieve our mission of enhancing the quality of life in our Resort Village by providing and maintaining quality parks, trails and green spaces, offering a range of innovative and accessible programming, and providing opportunities for physical activity, social interaction and community involvement.

Some highlights from 2021 included:

- Sandy Bay Festival of Lights: All display items remained in place and inflated. Enhancements to displays are considered each year.
- Mystical Forest Trail – This was a huge success with many individuals, community groups and businesses providing beautiful displays. Many people walked the Bay Lake North Trail to see the wonderful hidden gems.
- Fitness Programs - Yoga resumed on Zoom; both chair and floor classes were a success with many returning yogis. A new free program for seniors, Forever...in Motion, was successfully launched with many taking part in the two classes offered each week.
- Drama Club – We were pleased to form a new Drama Club. The Club chose the play "Honky Tonk Hissy Fit." The cast is now studying their lines, sets are being designed and stage lighting and sound are being planned. A date for the production will be announced soon.
- Sleigh Ride Partnership with the Candle Lake Golf Resort – Our Board was pleased to sponsor sleigh rides during the Golf Course annual tree lighting event held in December.
- Canada Day Drive - An informal "drive through the community" was held to honour our volunteer Firefighters and First Responders. Many community members came out to cheer.

We also applied for a Canada Day Heritage grant to support the purchase of fireworks for 2022.

- Candle Lake 2022 Fun Run - As Platinum Sponsors of this new event, the Board will fund the purchase of 400 medals which will be handed out to participants.

News from the **Resort Village**

February was a busy month for the Village as our staff were engaged in general operations and a variety of special projects. All departments of the Resort Village are currently working on major initiatives.

The Planning and Development Department is planning for the future as we work with other communities in the district on revisions to our Official Community Plan and a revised Zoning Bylaw for the Resort Village of Candle Lake. This project is dependent upon grant funding, but if approved will involve extensive community engagement later this year.

Meanwhile, the Parks and Recreation Department has already begun work on the 20-year Master Plan for Parks, Open Spaces and Trails. Along with the project team, we have already conducted some initial meetings with stakeholders and will continue to gather information. Watch for this team over the summer as they plan to attend public events to gather public input.

The Public Works Department has been working hard at keeping your streets clear of snow while also working on projects to improve our Lagoon and Landfill operations.

COVID-19 **Reminders**

As of February 28, masks are no longer required in indoor public spaces and the Province of Saskatchewan public health order to self isolate after contracting COVID-19 has expired. Masking is no longer required in all Resort Village run facilities including our Community Hall.

Still, we know that people in our community and our province continue to contract COVID-19, and we want everyone in our community to stay healthy!

If you have COVID-19 symptoms, please get tested and take steps to prevent spreading the virus. The province also continues to encourage vaccination, including the booster vaccine.

Maintaining our streets, lagoons and landfill is critical to maintaining quality services in our community.

The Financial Department is supporting our auditors as they complete the annual audit of the Village. At the same time, they are preparing information for Council to assist in planning for the coming year. Staff and Council strategic planning sessions will be conducted in March in preparation of the 2022 Village Budget.

The Village is continually looking for grant opportunities to fund future capital projects. We were pleased to receive notification earlier this year that an application dating back to September 2019 was approved for an extension to our walking trail along Highway 265. This project will extend a trail from Bereskin to Main Street and will improve safety while expanding our trail system in the Village.
