## News from the Trails Advisory Board

### July Feature Trail: Bay Lake North Trail and Bay Lake South Trail

Bay Lake is a small body of water, visible from Main Street when you look South. There are multiple hiking trails along this lake. Two of the trails are Bay Lake North and Bay Lake South. Both are loops which can be combined for a longer hike of approximately 8km. Bay Lake North Trail can be accessed from behind the ball diamond located on the recreation grounds or from the parking area located on the East side of highway 265, approximately 1km south of the Village office. Access to the trailhead for Bay Lake South Trail can also be found at this parking area.

The terrain on Bay Lake North Trail has roots, so careful footing is required. A section of the trail may be wet due to low areas however there is a cut-across to access the other side of the loop and return to your starting point. The surroundings on this trail vary from spruce, balsam, poplar, aspen and some grassy areas. The wonderful Mystical Forest adventure returns for the fourth year on this trail! The Mystical Forest is a plethora of community contributed mystical scenes and decorations. Members of the Sport, Culture and Recreation Board, property owners, visitors, community groups and businesses use their imagination to construct miniature displays with gnomes, fairies, trolls, bears, etc. along the trail. Hikers are encouraged to search for all the pieces of the exhibit while staying on the trail. Everyone is welcome to add their own environmentally sensitive creation to the adventure!

Work to widen Bay Lake North Trail started in 2023 and additional mulching will take place in 2024. For those active cross-country skiers at Candle Lake, the Trails Advisory Board has made recommendation to RVCL Administration to have the curve on the east side of this trail modified to make it less acute and more easily travelled while on skis.

Bay Lake South Trail is quite a bit narrower and mostly traverses through spruce. This trail is less travelled and more scenic.

Please ensure you are well prepared before heading out for a hike. Things to keep in mind when preparing for a hike: always tell someone where you are going or hike with a partner, bring safety equipment and wear appropriate shoes and clothing. Know your limits and check the trail distance and conditions on identified on the map before heading out on your hike.

## YOUTH ATV/UTV OPERATORS SAFETY CERTIFICATION COURSE

ATV/UTV falls under the category of Powered Mobile Equipment. Provincial legislation requires that ATV/UTV operators ages 12+/without a driver's license receive training and certification.

**Date:** July 8, 8:00 am - 4:00pm

**Ages:** 12+

**Cost:** \$250/registrant (payment required at time of registration)

**Location:** Starts at the Recreation Grounds Parking Lot. Various locations throughout the community (TBD) may be visited throughout the training.

**Preparing for the course:** Registrants must be familiar with Bylaw 13-2021 To Regulate the Operation of ATVs.

**PPE:** All participants must wear an approved helmet, safety glasses or face shield, gloves, long-sleeved shirt, full-length pants, and ankle high boots. We also highly recommend a rain jacket and pants; be prepared for rain and shine.

The Forest is a popular spot for local residents and tourists alike. Historical pictures and documents are located in the yard and the house. The Forest features a two-story Norwegian style cabin and other buildings. You will find five different trails with boardwalks, beautiful white spruce trees, marshes with black spruce, wildflowers, berry bushes and beautiful grasses. ## **2024 Election News**

The Resort Village of Candle Lake Municipal Election will be held Saturday, July 27, 2024. Updates to Election 2024 information will be provided on the Resort Village website under Resort Village Office or by clicking on this link: [Resort Village of Candle Lake 2024 Election](#).

• **Electing Mayor and 4 Councillors:** Starting May 15, 2024, candidates can pick up the Nomination Paper, Candidates Acceptance, Municipal Public Disclosure Statement at the Village office and must submit a Criminal Record Check.

• **Call for Nominations:** Starting Friday, June 7, 2024, nominations will be accepted at the Village Office during business hours.

• **Closing of Nominations:** Must be received on or before Saturday, June 22, 2024 at the Village Office. (The Village office will be open from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on June 22nd for any last-day nomination submissions.)

• **Advance Poll:** Friday, July 19, 2024 and Saturday, July 20, 2024 from 10 am to 3 pm at the Community Hall.

• **Election Day:** Saturday July 27, 2024 from 8 am to 9 pm at the Community Hall.

• **Candidate Eligibility:** As per The Local Government Elections Act, 2015:

- Candidates must be at least 18 years old on election day.
- Candidates must not be disqualified by any Act.
- Candidates must be Canadian citizens upon submitting the nomination paper.
- For resort village elections in Saskatchewan:
  - Candidates must have resided in the resort village or on its land for at least three consecutive months prior to submitting the nomination paper.
  - Alternatively, candidates may qualify if they are the assessed person for property within the resort village for at least three consecutive months prior to nomination, or they are the spouse of such a person.

• **Voter Eligibility:** As per The Local Government Elections Act, 2015:

- Eligible voters must be Canadian citizens.
- Eligible voters must be at least 18 years old.
- For resort village elections:
  - Eligible voters must have resided in the resort village or its land for at least three consecutive months preceding the election day.
  - Alternatively, eligible voters may qualify if they are the assessed person for property within the resort village for at least three consecutive months prior to election day, or they are the spouse of such a person.

• **Voter Identification:** As per The Local Government Regulations, 2015 Section 14 Appendix D:

- There will be no voters list; instead, voters must provide identification and proof of residency.
- Acceptable forms of identification include birth certificates, driver's licenses, passports, and health cards.
- Acceptable property verification includes assessment notices, tax notices, power bills, energy bills, etc.

• **Mail-in Ballots:** Residents can request a mail-in ballot kit, including an Application & Declaration, from the Village office or by filling out and submitting the request form available on our website.

- Great option for individuals over 65, those with health issues, or those unable to vote in person.
- Once nominations close, ballots will be printed and a kit will be sent with instructions for mailing back.
- Mail-in submissions must be received at the Village office before election day.
