News from Trails Advisory Board

Imagine

Imagine a place within Candle Lake where one can sit on a bench and watch the wind drive white cap waves up on a rocky shore with thunderous sounds. Imagine watching some of the most glorious Candle Lake sunsets from the very same vantage point only this time the fading lights of the day play on the ripples of a gentle lake.

This all can happen when one walks on the Nobles Point Nature Trail and sits on the bench placed by Sask 100 funds in 2007.

This nature trail, Candle Lake's only true nature trail complete with signage was created by early trails advisory members by following a game trail along an ice push ridge and then moving through a forest to the rocky shores of Nobles Point. It was cut by a prison crew supervised by Don Moore, who as a youth hunted big game from a "hunter's base" built on the point (remnants still visible).

The trail is relatively short but quite rugged as it crosses many large spruce tree roots, low areas with ferns, thistles and nettles (well trimmed), past a fox den, trapper's shelter, boardwalk over water in wet seasons and then the bench with its views. This trail was created in the heart of Candle Lake to allow people to totally escape the sounds, smells and activities of a busy resort lake. If you seek a place for solitude and beauty in a complete natural setting, try a hike on this trail, it will not disappoint. Enjoy the trail.

- Economic strength: maintaining population and tax bases helps sustain community vitality when residents are able to remain in their homes and neighbourhoods.

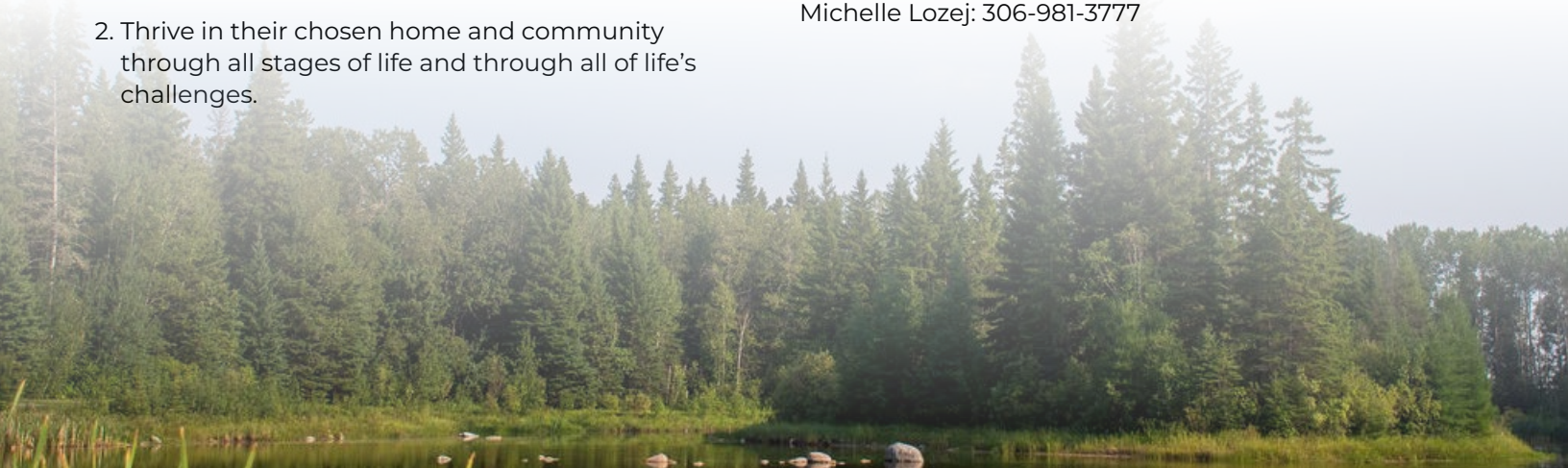

News from **COPPS**

COPPS patrols watch for suspicious activity in neighbourhoods throughout our community. We patrol at all times of the day and night and will always have our reflective shields on both sides of our vehicles.

See suspicious activity in or around your neighbourhood? Please call the community dispatcher at 306-960-1855.

As fall advances into winter residents are advised to ensure their properties are neat and secured for the off-season. Remove the crimes of opportunity by ensuring valuables are secured out of sight and doors and windows are locked. The fall period often has a higher-than-normal frequency of break-ins. If possible, have neighbours keep an eye on your property. ALWAYS report suspicious activity to the Community Dispatch at 306-960-1855. Ensure valuables and easily stolen items are appropriately marked and/or identified (e.g., serial numbers) as this may help law enforcement identify and return recovered items.

We encourage residents and business owners that have video surveillance cameras to register their contact information with Candle Lake COPPS. This information is kept secure and confidential. No one will ask to see your video unless there is an incident in your area. The registry will increase efficiency of law enforcement officers gathering pertinent video footage if an event occurs at or near your address.

Your video surveillance may help solve another crime in our community even if your property is not affected. Only the RCMP or Community Safety Officers will ever ask your explicit permission to view the video footage. Please email CandleLakeCOPPS@gmail.com to obtain a camera registry form or pick up a form in the display case at the RVCL Office. On the Ground in Crowsnest Pass: A Highway 55N Search and Rescue Volunteer's Story

When the call came about the missing boy in Crowsnest Pass, Alberta, our Highway 55N Search & Rescue team (HWY55N SAR) prepared to assist. Five of our members, with the unwavering support of our local HWY55N SAR team and Search and Rescue Saskatchewan Association of Volunteers (SARSAV) volunteered to head west.

Although much of our work takes place in Northern Saskatchewan, this search required extra capacity. Five of us packed our gear and made the trip to Crowsnest Pass. It was a long drive, but we understood the importance of being there.

The search base was well organized and bustling with RCMP officers, Incident Command posts, Salvation Army food services, dog teams, equine search teams, drone pilots, and volunteers from Alberta, British Columbia, and Saskatchewan. The terrain was steep and rugged, and the search had already been

underway for several days. After a briefing, we were shuttled up the mountain in ATVs to ground searches in designated forested areas.

Our work involved moving methodically through challenging terrain and carefully scanning the ground and surroundings for signs of the little boy. Conditions changed throughout the day, and temperatures dropped each night. Although we were from out of province, local teams welcomed

us, and we worked together as a unified team.

Local volunteers and organizations provided steady support. A nearby Bible camp offered us a place to sleep between search days, which was greatly appreciated.

Taking part in the Crowsnest Pass search reinforced why we volunteer. It is about contributing where we can, working alongside others, and supporting families and communities during difficult times.

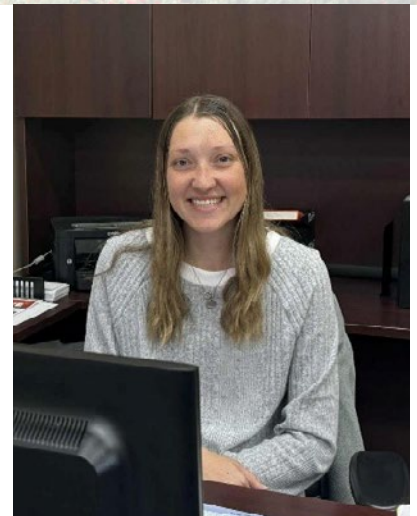

During the winter, our Snow Ambulance trailer will be hooked up and ready to go for snowmobile season.

From spring to fall, the new vehicle will be used as a fire suppression apparatus and provide a fast response to fires that occur within the Resort Village also. It will also be made available to Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency with firefighters from the Resort Village operating it.

Preparing for Winter

Public Works staff are actively preparing for the winter season. In addition to our regular duties, current winter preparation activities include:

- Graveling Village roads — approximately 16 km (9.94 miles) completed so far with 2,100 yards of gravel applied.
- Spreading 310 yards of rock throughout the community Village grounds to improve functionality and appearance.
- Installing snow fence in key locations with assistance from the Saskatchewan Penitentiary Work Gang.
- Removing flower baskets, delineators, and rubber parking stops from roadways.
- Blowing out drainage lines and removing water pumps before freeze-up.
- Preparing the Village's winter road salt and sand mixture.
- Finishing priority drainage work before freeze-up.
- Performing regular maintenance in preparation for winter operations.

Brush Burning

Brush burning at the Landfill will begin once an appropriate amount of snow has fallen and a burn permit has been issued by the Fire Chief. Metal accumulated over the summer season will also be scheduled for recycling pickup at that time.

New Loader Ready for Winter Season

The Resort Village of Candle Lake is the proud owner of a new 2025 John Deere Loader, a purchase which was included in this year's approved budget.

Staff have received orientation on using the new loader and our snow bucket has been attached – we're ready to take on the winter weather ahead!

This unit replaces our 2009 loader, which will be repurposed and dedicated for working at the landfill and as a backup machine if needed. Having a loader on-site at the landfill will significantly reduce travel time for daily operations and improve overall efficiency for our Public Works team.

Council Meeting Highlights

The following items were discussed at the September and October Council Meetings:

RVCL Age Friendly Community – To ensure our services are more age friendly, Council passed a resolution to improve accessibility and inclusion for older persons, individuals with disabilities, and children and youth. This resolution aligns with our Strategic Plan and enables the Village to enroll in Saskatchewan Age Friendly Community Recognition Program.

Volunteers Supporting Aging in Place – Council endorsed a grant application through the New Horizons for Seniors Program to develop a volunteer program. This will be developed in coordination with the Health Services Committee to support residents aging in place.

Equipment Disposal and Procurement - Council directed Administration to proceed with the sale of the 2022 Garbage truck which has been replaced with our refurbished 2010 garbage truck. Council approved the purchase of a new John Deere Front End Loader from Brandt Tractor. The loader was approved in the 2025 Budget. The existing 2009 Loader will be dedicated for use at the Landfill which will save considerable time travelling each day. It will also be used as a backup if required.

Development Appeals Decision, Hangar Construction #14 Oak Place – Council received a report from Administration recommending they accept the determination of the Development Appeals Board which upheld the conditions placed on a permit by RVCL. This includes that a primary dwelling be constructed on the property within two years and to remove other conditions including the requirement for a security deposit.

Candle Lake Pickle Ball Club – Council approved the club to qualify under the Charitable Receipt Policy which allows the Village to issue tax deductible charitable receipts on their behalf.

Sport Culture Recreation New Board Members – Council appointed Lisa Beres, Shirley Mathieson and Larry Mathieson to the SCRB Advisory Committee.

Emergency Response Plan - Council adopted the revised RVCL Emergency Response Plan. The new plan complies with the Emergency Planning Act (Saskatchewan), aligns with current best practices, and reflects updated community information.

Lagoon Expansion Project – At a Special Meeting, Council accepted the recommendation from Associated Engineers to award the tender to the lowest compliant proponent, Get Green Erosion Ltd. for \$5,248,187.50. The estimated total cost of the Lagoon Expansion Project is \$6,600,000 and will be funded through the Federal Provincial ICIP Grant Program which will cover approximately \$4,840,000 with the balance to be funded through RVCL capital reserves and internal financing.
