

Feature Trail: Deep Bay Nature Trail

Fall is usually the best hiking/walking season. In September, the bugs have abated, the winds have settled and weather is generally less extreme. If you're looking for an enjoyable walk try the Deep Bay Nature Trail.

The trail meanders through a variety of ecosystems; old growth forest, wind-blown deadfall, low lying wetlands and higher dry ground. The outer loop follows the shore wall shaped over years by freezing and thawing ice, offering views that range from rugged rocky shorelines to reed covered bays teeming with waterfowl. Watch for eagles, pileated woodpeckers, and many other varieties of wildlife. Giant squirrel middens can be observed along the trail, one located under the remnants of a log hunting cabin.



Parking is available at Musker Pond. The trailheads are located on the North side of highway 265. The outer loop spans approximately 4k while the inner loop covers 2k. Wayfinding signs are posted along the route & maps are available for download from the RVCL website.

News from the COPPS

COPPS patrols watch for suspicious activity in neighbourhoods throughout our community. We patrol at all times of the day and night and will always have our reflective shields on both sides of our vehicles. Please call the community dispatcher at 306-960-1855 if you see suspicious activity.

COPPS dramatically increased patrols over the May-June time frame in a response to the limited number residents in place during the pre-evacuation. As the summer comes to an end residents are advised to ensure their properties are cleaned up and secured for the fall and winter period. The fall period often has a higher-than-normal frequency of break-ins due to lower frequency of occupancy. If possible, have neighbours keep an eye on your property.

ALWAYS report suspicious activity to the Community Dispatch at 306-960-1855. Even if your property is not broken into when your neighbour reports this suspicious activity to Community Dispatch then law enforcement officers are alerted of the activity and will have a better idea for what to watch for in our community. Ensure valuables and easily stolen items are appropriately marked and/or identified (e.g., serial numbers) because this will help law enforcement identify and potentially return these items to you if stolen and recovered.

We encourage residents and business owners that have video surveillance cameras to register their contact information with Candle Lake COPPS. This information is kept secure and confidential. No one will ask to see your video unless there is an incident in your area. The registry will increase efficiency of law enforcement officers gathering pertinent video footage if an event occurs at or near your address. Your video surveillance may help solve another crime in our community even if your property is not affected. Only the RCMP or Community Safety Officers will ever ask your explicit permission to view the video footage. - TIPPS (Tax Installment Payment Plan Service Program) - TIPPS offers equalized monthly property tax payments. To sign up for TIPPS, withdraw from TIPPS, or change your banking information for TIPPS, please contact the Resort Village at (306) 929-2236 or info@candlelake.ca.
- Print and complete the Preauthorized Debit Form to make recurring payments from your account. Return the completed form to the Resort Village Office by scanning and emailing it to info@candlelake.ca, or by dropping off a copy.
- The deadline to pay your property tax is August 31st of each year.
- Interest of 1.8% will be applied to any taxes owing starting September 1, 2025.

August Council Meeting Highlights

The following items were dealt with at the August Council Meetings:

Shoe Wildfire – Administration presented a comprehensive report of the community response to the Shoe Wildfire. The cost incurred by the Resort Village to respond to the wildfire threat totaled just under \$200,000. In addition, residents contributed over 1,300 hours in unpaid volunteer time to support the response. Expense claims have been submitted to the SPSA under The Wildfire Act for eligible wildfire prevention, preparedness, and mitigation costs. Volunteers were invited to attend a recognition ceremony following the August Council Meeting and received a challenge coin from the Fire Chief in recognition of their contribution towards the Fire response.

Dock, Boat Lift and Watercraft Bylaw 05-2018 – Council discussed a report from Administration concerning the existing bylaw 05-2018 regulating docks in the Resort Village. Council directed Administration to collect more information and report back.

RVCL Cemetery Registration - Council approved a resolution approving the submission of an application to register the Candle Lake Cemetery with the Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority (FCAA) of Saskatchewan. All Cemeteries are to be registered with this agency. Administration reported that the new plots have been surveyed, and a number have already been sold. Service Agreement Blk. D Plan 72PA06478 – Council authorized the execution of a Service Agreement to service the newly created residential lot which included a \$4,000 off site service fee for capital costs of infrastructure for Lot 2A Parcel D Plan 72PA06478 on Lakeview Drive.

Sale of Dedicated Land – Council approved the sale of a strip of dedicated land to the abutting property owner. The sale was part of a previously approved proposal to replot property boundaries along 3rd Crescent South.

Tax Enforcement – Council authorized tax enforcement proceedings on properties with more than 50% of their taxes outstanding from 2024.

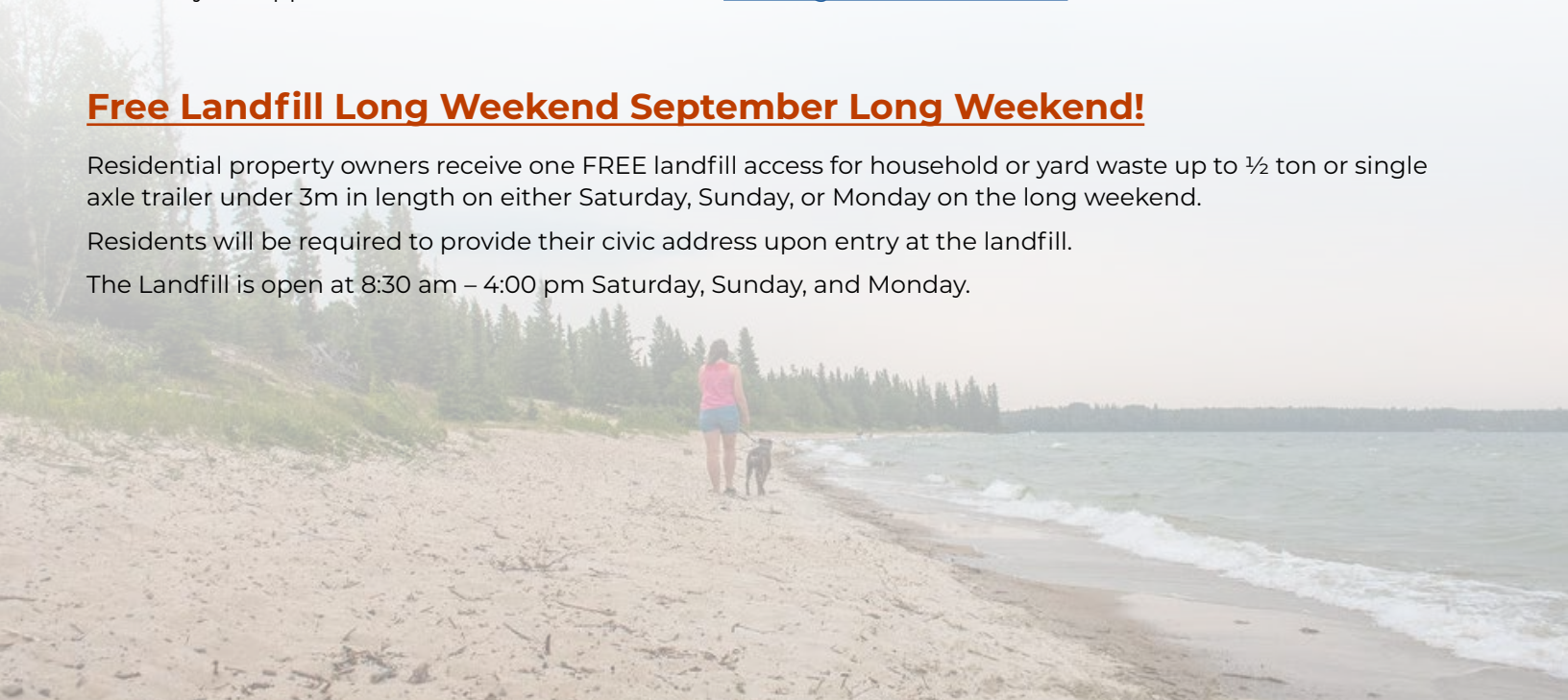
