When any group or a community event needs a helping hand, Colleen is always willing to participate and assist as needed.

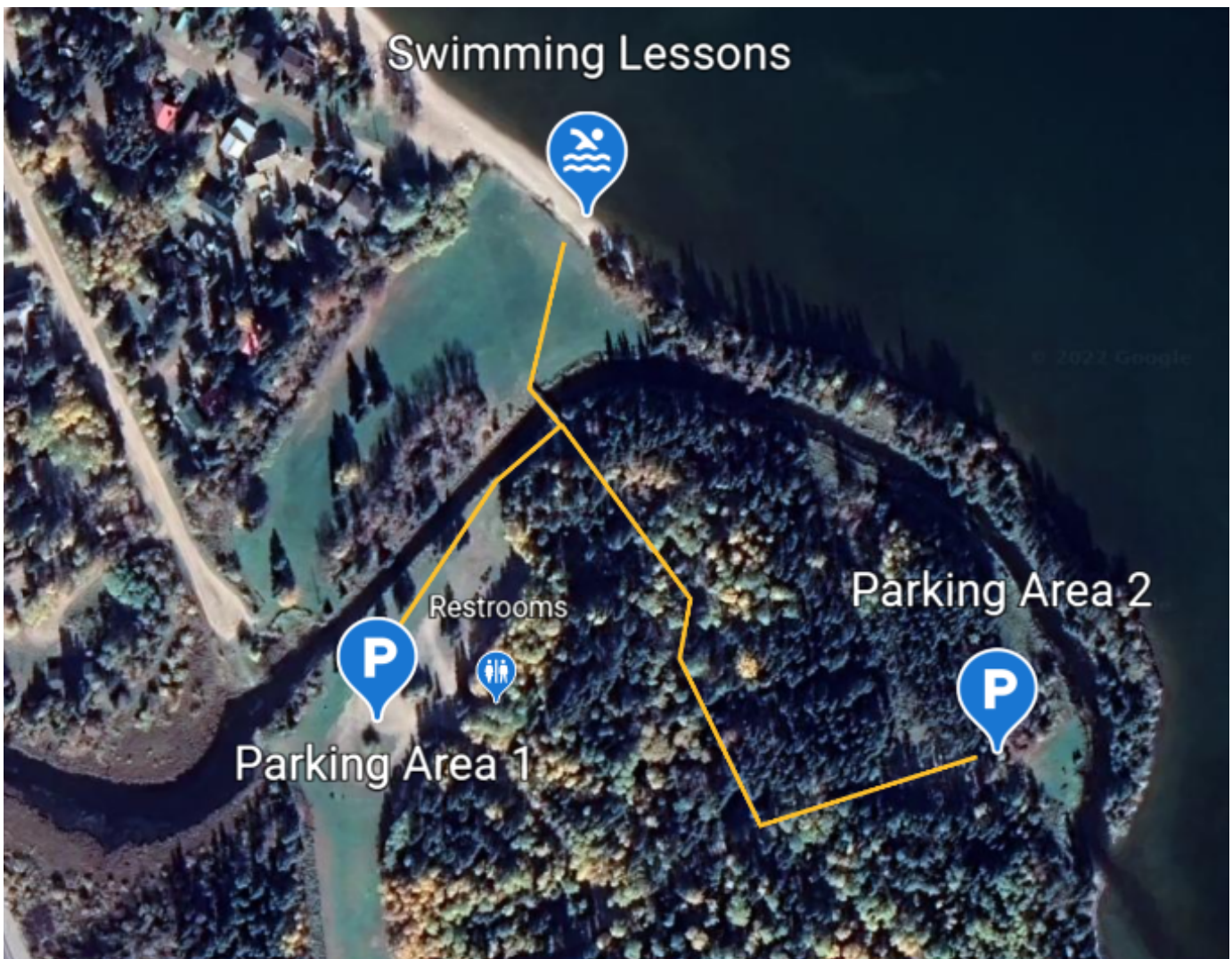
Through her dedication, enthusiasm and leadership, Colleen has enhanced the quality of life for the residents of Candle Lake.

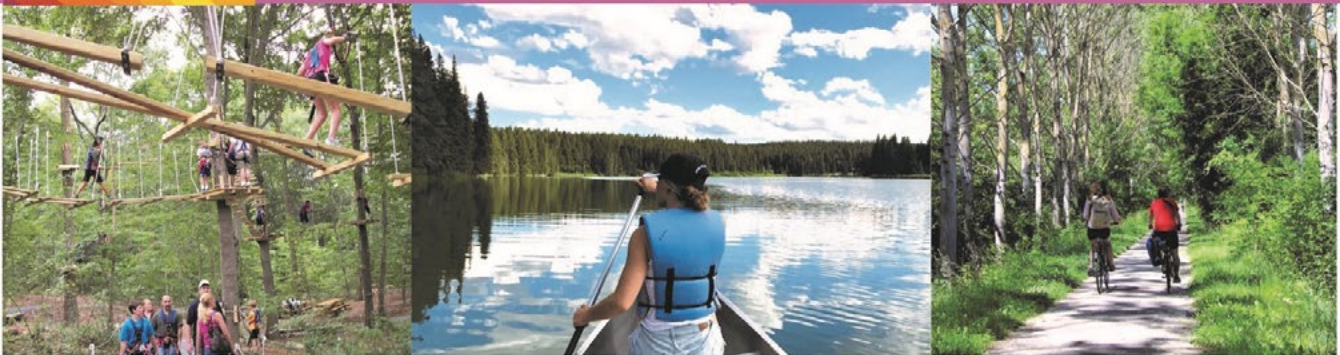

CANDLE LAKE 20 YR MASTER PLAN

PARKS, OPEN SPACES, AND TRAILS



Engagement on the future of recreation and quality of life at Candle Lake will continue through the summer. The Resort Village website continues to be updated with information including:

- A video walk-thru of ideas being considered for development over the next 20 years.
- The display boards from the Welcome Back event held on May 21st.
- A link to the survey of recreation needs and perceptions at Candle Lake (available at www.surveymonkey.com/r/CandleLake).
- Frequently Asked Questions about the Master Plan.

Two of the most common questions asked about the Plan are: Why is the Resort Village undertaking this Master Plan, and what will happen to property taxes as a result of this Plan?

Why is a Master Plan for Parks, Open Spaces, and Trails needed?

At 38% growth since the last census, the Resort Village of Candle Lake is among Saskatchewan's fastest growing communities! More residents and

visitors to the community means more pressure on the beautiful natural features that attract people here. Smart development of recreation infrastructure helps sustain, and even enhance, these features into the future while also enabling access and enjoyment.

What will this Plan mean for property taxes?

The development and maintenance of recreation infrastructure is an important responsibility for the Resort Village. A Master Plan would enable more strategic spending of existing and future dollars. Once the Master Plan is created from the shared vision of Candle Lake, an implementation strategy would be developed. The strategy would provide recommendations on timing and phasing of proposed improvements. Recommendations from the strategy would be considered each year by the Resort Village Council when they prepare annual budgets.

The reconstruction of the flower bed at the entrance to the RVCL grounds is now complete and planting is done. The village workers removed the old structure and dirt and CiB volunteers assembled the new structure. Candle lake Sand and Gravel delivered the new soil and levelled it.

Aschim After the Rains

Last month's wanderings at Aschim saw the place in a very wonderful "spring" condition. This month it is a different story as some heavy rain over a few days has brought change. The rushing water is still there, exaggerated by some heavy flows on the West Creek and Birchbark Creek. Mosquitoes are definitely out in full force but most hikers have the technology to combat that. The boardwalk and the path as far as the lightning tree are higher and drier. The marsh marigolds in this area along the boardwalks are just beginning to bloom and they will be spectacular. The major pathways to the house are open. The connecting pathways around the Beaver Pond Trail are very wet (use rubber boots).

Congrats to the nature walkers (a group organized by seniors but open to anyone) who did the Aschim walk after the rain and survived to tell of it. They may have got wet feet but did see a wonderful variety of flowering plant life. Give the place a little time to dry up and it will be great.

Aschim maps are on the Village web site, the local businesses have brochures available and the newest place to get personal info and pick up the brochures is at our library. Get out and enjoy Candle Lake's best hiking system.

Other quick links take you directly to our Business Directory and Photo Gallery where you will find hundreds of beautiful images of our community.
