Sign up for Scuba / Snorkel lessons with the Resort Village of Candle Lake! Sessions will be held from 2:00 to 4:00 pm on the following dates at Mosher Park (on King's Way, Lakeside Subdivision):

- Tuesday August 8
- Thursday August 10

The sessions will aim to increase fascination of underwater environments using safe shallow water entry practices and skills under close supervision with a certified instructor. The cost to attend a session is \$50 per person, per session, and payment is required upon registration. Each participant must sign a waiver three days prior to the session start date. “Trail Exploration Challenge” Contest Deadline August 15, 2023

Second Guest Book Completed at Aschim

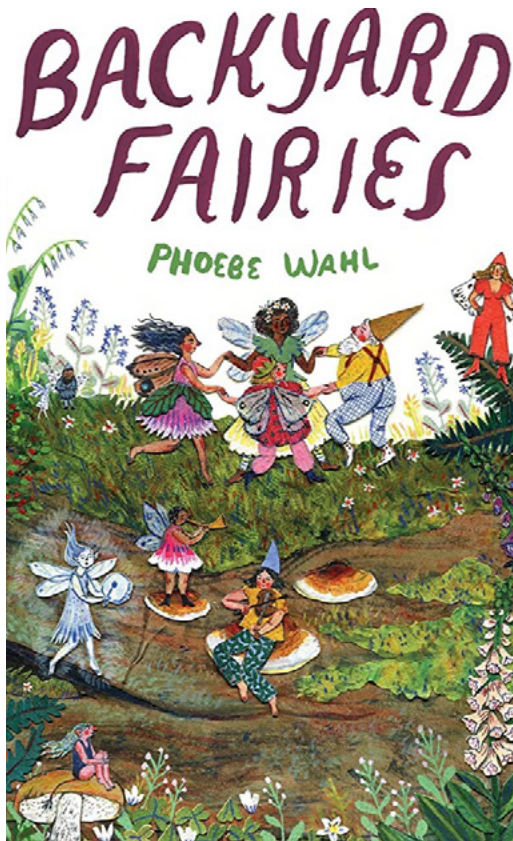

Tisdale Day Camp was a great success with 61 children attending. Thank you to Victoria and her staff!

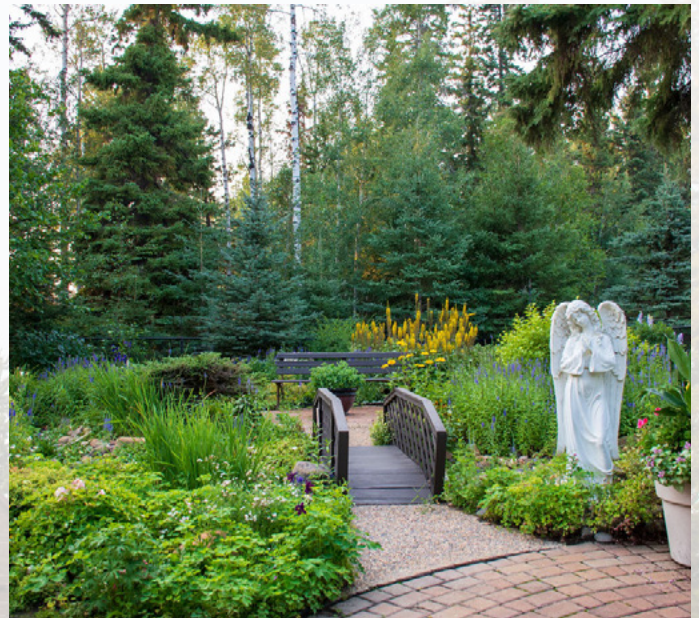

New Fire Chief/Emergency Services Manager for Candle Lake

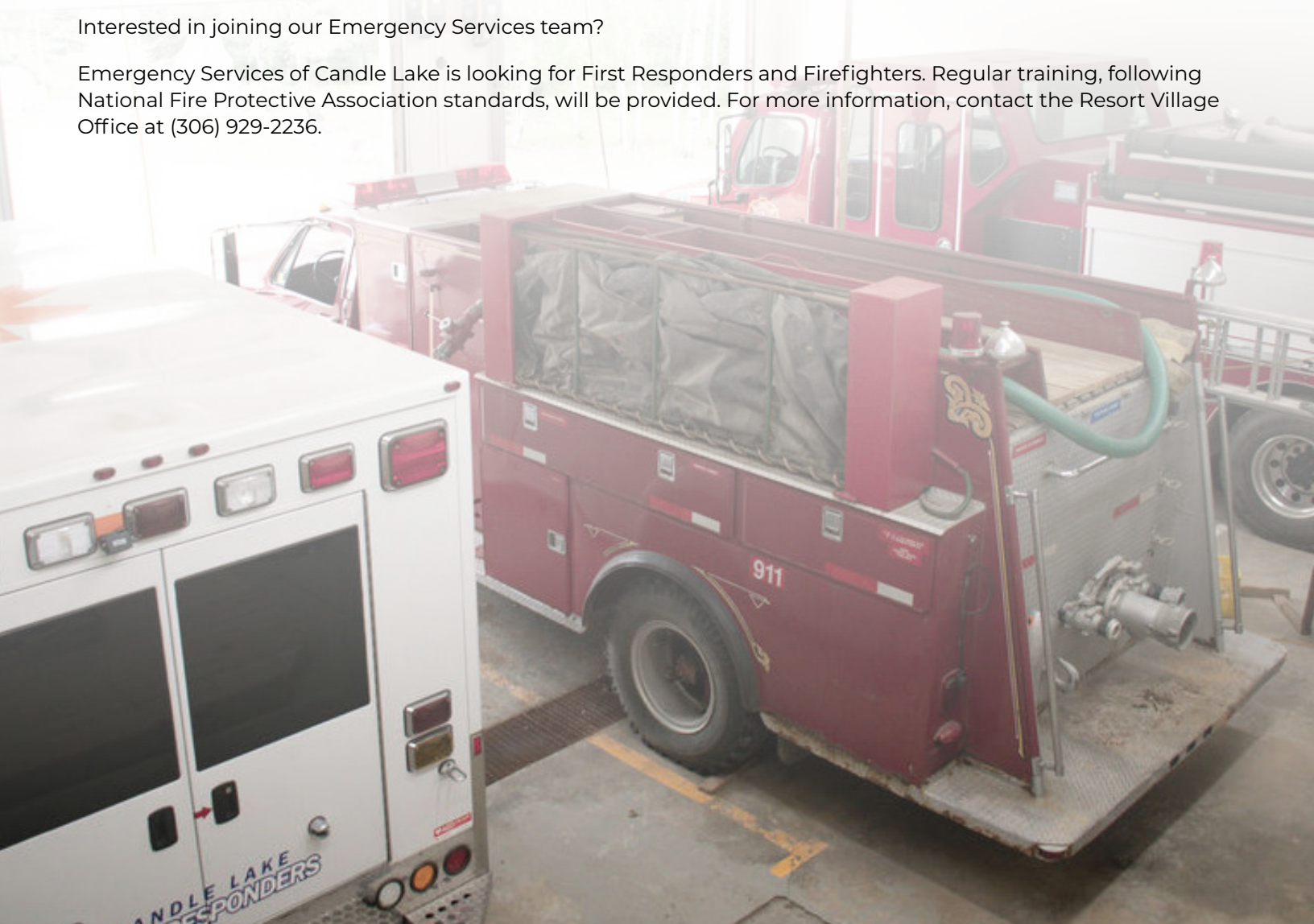

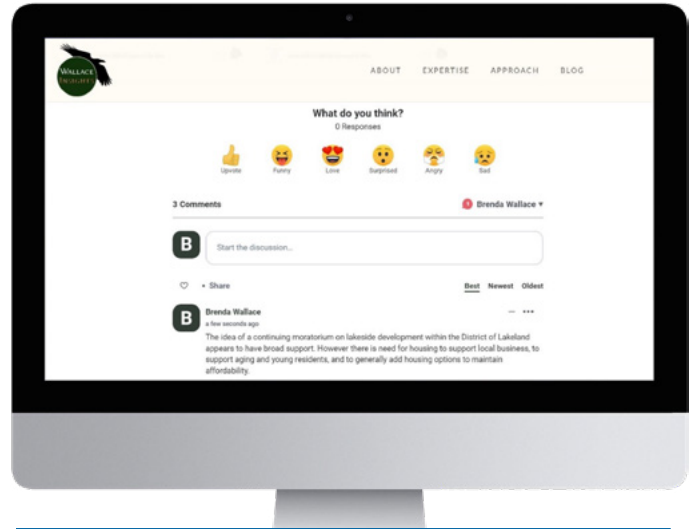

Did You Know?

The Resort Village of Candle Lake Residential Waste Collection Fee includes:

- Weekly streetside waste collection
- Waived gate fees for up to two bags of household garbage and small amount of yard waste weekly
- Free weekends at the landfill over the high season long weekends
- Pick up of bagged/bundled yard refuse and waste week following May, August & September long weekends
- Recycling of residential cardboard and other items
- A portion of the fee will be put into a reserve fund to cover the capital cost to develop a landfill cell or transfer station in the future, estimated to be required in about 10 year's time.

The Residential Waste Collection and Disposal Fee of \$8.33 per month will help address past compliance issues, new regulatory requirements and capital shortfalls associated with recapping the old landfill cell. The fee is expected to cover ongoing operational and future capital costs, allowing RVCL to meet closure costs of the existing cell and construction costs of a new cell, or establishing a future transfer station depending on regulatory requirements at that time. The lifespan of the current cell is estimated to be 10 years depending upon usage.

PLEASE NOTE: The next free landfill weekend is August 5-7. From August 8-11 bagged and bundled yard refuse will be picked up street side along with your regular household waste. (Monday pickup will be moved to Tuesday that week only).
