Citizen's on Patrol Program

We are now into fall and winter patrolling. Fall is a time for locking up cabins for the winter. Please be diligent to secure your property from potential thieves. It is important to report all theft or break-ins to the R.C.M.P. at (306) 310-RCMP (7267).

Theft and burglary are crimes of opportunity that usually happen to those of us who are least prepared. This fall don't provide a thief with opportunity - protect your property and equipment! Be sure to lock all your vehicles. Citizens on Patrol Program is a group of volunteers who continue to be dedicated to helping the Smeaton RCMP and the Candle Lake Community Safety Officers keep the Candle Lake area a safe community. Volunteers patrol the area constantly, looking for signs of criminal activity and reporting to the RCMP. Patrol is both day and night, and because the group members are anonymous, you never know when COPPS is out there. The group is looking for new patrollers. If you would like to donate financially to the COPPS program, tax deductible receipts are available. The next meeting of the group will be at the call of the chairman.

The updated version of the Activity Trails map is also available on the RVCL Website, along with maps for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Trail Head maps will also be updated over the next few months.

The new walking path on the berm along Highway 265 is progressing, more information will be provided next month.

The fall season is a great time to take advantage of the trails. Beautiful fall colours, drier ground conditions, and fewer pesky mosquitoes should add to your enjoyment of our natural environment.

We would like to remind everyone that motorized vehicles such as ATVs should not be on the West Side Trail, which is intended for pedestrians. Motorized traffic creates ruts and increases the chance of eroding the crusher dust surface we all love to walk on year round.

News from the **Resort Village**

Examining Resort Village Housing Needs

• At its September meeting, Resort Village Council passed a resolution and approved funding to proceed immediately with a Housing Needs Assessment that would explore the viability of a housing project in the Resort Village geared toward residents aged 55 and over. The idea for such a project came to light during conversations at the Welcome to the Lake event in early summer. Residents identified there is a gap in the availability of housing for older adults and seniors who wish to remain living in Candle Lake in their senior years but would like to downsize their properties to suit their needs as they age. The residents formed an informal group to discuss the matter further and approached Administration about adding the topic to the Sustainability Planning public engagement sessions held this summer. Based on these conversations, Wallace Insights, who is leading our Sustainability Planning, brought forward a proposal to conduct a proper Housing Needs Assessment, that would include formal public engagement, and look more deeply at details like a potential land location, age limits of residents, affordability, housing sizes, etc. More information on how you can take part in engaging about this project will be provided as plans are further developed.

Parks, Trails and Open Spaces Master Plan

• As summer has reached its end, we will be wrapping up our survey process for the Candle Lake Parks, Trails and Open Space Master Plan project. Once we have our final survey results in hand, we will begin to develop the final master plan concepts. The project team will provide a revised set of drawings for review this Fall. THANK YOU to those who took part in the engagement process! Your input has been invaluable to the development of the Plan. Lagoon Operations

• As part of our operations plan to responsibly manage the capacity of our lagoons, on September 1, 2022, the Resort Village began diverting septic haulers to the West Lagoon. An inspection of our lagoons in 2020 found that several repairs to our systems were required. In 2021 repairs were completed. Also in 2021, a report on the operation of the lagoons was prepared which included several other recommendations to help us better manage our wastewater services. Did You Know?

• In response to some questions residents have raised about the current water level of Candle Lake, the Resort Village reached out to the Water Security Agency (WSA), who is responsible for actively monitoring the water levels on Candle Lake and operating the dam. The WSA advised that many factors go into developing operating plans including stakeholder needs and the safety of the dam. Candle Lake has a desired operating range of 494.23 m to 494.38 m. Throughout the summer months the lake fluctuated between 494.28 m and 494.48 m. In September, the WSA completes an annual drawdown to reach the bottom of the desired operating range by October. The structure released water to allow for riparian flow and closed for the winter on September 23, 2022. The water level on Candle Lake is currently 494.19m, which is 4 cm below the desired operating range. Being at the bottom end of the range allows room in the basin for winter inflows and spring runoff. They anticipate the lake to remain near this level for the remainder of the fall.

A Friendly Reminder

• With the fall and winter season approaching, it's time to get ready for the coming snowfall. Please remove any objects that could hinder the snow clearing process such as garbage stands and other objects. If you have markers identifying your approach, make sure they are back far enough to not obstruct the grader.
