## Fifteenth Anniversary for Curl/Ski Day

In March 2008 the Candle Lake Sno Skiers and the Candle Lake Curling Club hosted the first Curl/Ski Day with some Community Grant financing from Parks and Rec. with the rest supplied by Community businesses and Ski membership money from the Sno Skiers who were formed to clear and groom the Cross Country ski trails as well as Baldy.

Parks and Rec. has been involved with this event through providing Community Grant money (from Sask Lottery sales) for Ski instruction and rentals from Fresh Air Experience in Prince Albert as well as curling club facility costs for both aspects of the day since inception. The ski trails and training grids have always been prepped by, first the Sno Skiers, then Parks and Rec. and now Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board.

On January 25, 2023 the Grade Seven students from Meath Park School participated in the Curl/Ski Day, and on January 27, 2023, the Grade Eight and Nine students attended.

Thanks again for Parks and Rec. funding, Fresh Air Experience equipment and instruction, Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board groomers and assistant instructors and curling club members providing facility, instruction and, of course, wonderful food. From all reports the Meath Park Grade Sevens and teacher supervisors were very impressed with our hospitality.

This event allows for introduction to very low cost sports of skiing and curling and the social interaction that goes with it. Students, instructing adults and even parents can leave feeling very good about learning new things about themselves and their community. We all await next year!!

## 2023 Swimming Lessons

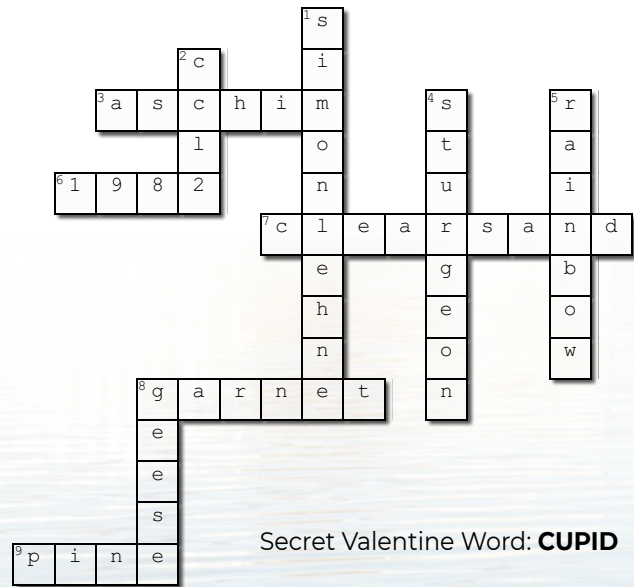

You will only receive a notice of reassessment if you made improvements to your property last year.
