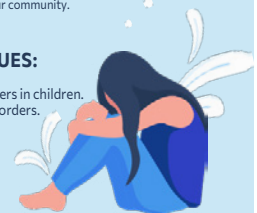

WHAT IS SOCIAL PRESCRIBING?

Social prescribing connects people with non-medical supports, activities, and community resources that improve wellbeing. It recognizes that health is shaped by more than symptoms — it's shaped by connection, purpose, stability, and belonging.

Supports may include:

- Community groups & activities
- Mental health and counselling resources
- Volunteer opportunities
- Peer support & social clubs
- Financial, housing, or practical assistance
- Transportation navigation
- Nature based & cultural activities

WHO IS SOCIAL PRESCRIBING FOR?

Our program is primarily geared toward adults aged 55+ who may be experiencing life transitions, changes in mobility, caregiving roles, or shifts in social networks.

WHY SOCIAL PRESCRIBING WORKS

- Personalized to your goals and interests
- Community based and locally connected
- Collaborative, linking health care with community supports

WHO BENEFITS MOST?

Candle Lake Emergency Services **Emergency Preparedness**

Summer brings outdoor fun but also severe weather like thunderstorms, extreme heat, and wildfires. To protect yourself, monitor Environment Canada alerts, take immediate shelter during storms, practice heat safety, secure your property against high winds, and create a family emergency plan.

WATCH THE SKY

- **Stay Informed:** Monitor Environment Canada alerts for storms or tornadoes. A Watch means severe conditions are possible; a Warning means they are happening.
- **Get Alerts:** Use weather apps and sign up for wireless emergency notifications.

TAKE SHELTER

- **During Storms:** Immediately move indoors. Head to the basement or an interior, windowless room on the lowest floor.
- **Avoid Hazards:** Stay away from windows and large, unsupported roofs. If outdoors, abandon water activities.
- **Prepare Property:** Bring in pets, secure loose outdoor objects, and close all windows and doors.

HEAT AND HUMIDITY SAFETY

- **Stay Cool:** Limit intense outdoor exercise, drink plenty of fluids, and take frequent, shaded breaks.
- **Monitor Health:** Watch for signs of heat exhaustion or heat stroke, and ensure pets and livestock have constant access to fresh water.

INSPECT & PROTECT YOUR HOME

- **Mitigate Damage:** Install surge protectors to protect electronics from lightning.
- **Routine Maintenance:** Reinforce windows, repair loose roof shingles, and clear dead branches from your property to reduce wildfire and flying debris risks. Clean gutters regularly to prevent heavy rain damage.

HAVE A PLAN

- Establish a family emergency plan, agree on a designated meeting place, and ensure everyone knows how to contact each other.

Candle Lake Emergency Services: Ready When Emergencies Happen



Candle Lake Emergency Services, including its team of 24 firefighters and 13 Emergency Medical Responders, are here to help in case of an emergency incident.

Our goal is to provide a quality service to the citizens and visitors of Candle Lake by arriving at an emergency incident with 7 minutes of the time we receive a notification from Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency dispatch.

Our Attack Fire Apparatus includes:

- Two trucks are equipped with a 300 gallon of water, pump, hose and equipment for fire suppression; these trucks also have rescue capabilities.
- One third truck is equipped with 150 gallons of water and an ultra high-pressure pump.

The trucks are strategically positioned within the Village so that we can provide a quicker response to emergency incidents within Candle Lake and area.

June Council Highlights

Correspondence - Council received the correspondence including the following items.

1. T. Kostyna and R. Lang concerning video recording and streaming council meetings. Council directed Administration to report back to the July Executive Committee Meeting with the possibility of commencing this in July.
2. B. Green, Provincial Protective Services Branch concerning a significant increase in human/bear interactions around Candle Lake. Council referred the correspondence to Administration to report back on possible a refuse collection solution that will ensure attractants are kept inaccessible to dangerous wildlife.

Council Notice of Motion – In recognition of the important role of the Village Administration, a motion was moved and unanimously passed by Council expressing its full confidence in and support of the CAO and Management Team for the RVCL and committing to a respectful, collaborative and professional working relationship.

North Central Planning District Official

Community Plan – Council gave first reading to a bylaw to adopt the new NCPD Official Community Plan. Public Notice of a Public Hearing at the July 23rd Council Meeting will be issued prior to 2nd and 3rd reading at the Council Meeting.

RVCL Zoning Bylaw – Council gave final reading to adopt Zoning Bylaw 05-2026. The new Zoning Bylaw will not come into effect until final approval by the Minister.

Bylaw Enforcement – Council appointed Cole Berge as a Bylaw Enforcement Officer for the RVCL. Cole was hired as a new member of our CSO Service and once appointed by the minister will also be approved to enforce certain Provincial Acts. With the departure of officer S, Sabados this will bring our compliment of officers back up to two.

Advisory Committees – Council appointed Roxanne Tremblay as a committee member on the Trails Advisory Board and Val Middlebrook as a committee member of the Health Services Board. Welcome to our new members. Anyone interested in becoming involved on one of our advisory committees can contact our Community Engagement Manager Erin Maloy.

Commercial Land Sale - Council approved the Land Sale Agreement for the sale of 4.05 Acres of commercial land along Hwy 265 for the development of Phase 1 of Timber Gate Plaza.

Paving Repairs - Council approved a sole source contract with Ruszkowski Enterprises for shaping and paving for the following three projects, Hwy 265 Service Road access approach, Hwy 265 Lakeview Drive access approach and parking and accessible entrance ramps on the South and West sides of the Community Hall.
