A registered nurse will assess your symptoms and help you decide whether to treat your own symptoms, go to a clinic, see your primary health care provider, or access emergency medical care, if necessary.

HealthLine 811 also provides mental health and addictions support. HealthLine's registered Psychiatric Nurses and Registered Social workers can offer crisis support, advice to help you manage your situation, and connections to resources in your community.

Volunteer Coordinator Funding Approved

We are pleased to announce that we have received funding to support a new Volunteer Coordinator for Health Services at Candle Lake. Thank you to Saskatchewan Seniors Mechanism who approved the Facilitating Independence Grant for our project - "Candle Lake Alive & Well – The Next Steps.

BUILDING ESSENTIAL SUPPORTS IN OUR COMMUNITY

Candle Lake is a community where many residents choose to retire. Today, with approximately 1,300 permanent residents, an estimated 65% are over the age of 60, and nearly 40% are over 70. As our population ages, more residents face challenges remaining safely and independently in their own homes.

Unlike urban centers, our community does not have public transportation, meal programs, or extensive in-home and caregiver supports. Candle Lake Health Services is working to build some of these essential supports through trained and supported community volunteers.

A Volunteer Coordinator will work in partnership with Village Administration and the Health Services Committee to develop safe, effective, and well-supported volunteer services. Once the foundation is in place, volunteer recruitment will begin and new services will be launched to support residents as they age in place — safely and independently — in the community we all love.

We thank our funding partner for investing in this important initiative that strengthens collaboration and builds local capacity. By building it here we hope to collaborate and share our work as templates for other small communities to implement.

More information, including details about the upcoming part-time term position, will be shared in the coming weeks. Please help us spread the word — the right person for this role will be someone from our own community! Maybe YOU!

News from the Candle Lake Emergency Services Emergency Preparedness

Spring is around the corner and as a part of Emergency Preparedness we are providing information on getting ready for the spring thaw.

As the sun gets stronger and winter gear gets slowly put away, seed catalogs are becoming a part of our reading. In Saskatchewan, we always look forward to springtime!

However, there are a few things to keep in mind to be ready for specific emergencies the new season can bring, such as increased risk of flooding as snow melts away.

With this in mind, here are our tips to help get you ready for a fun and safe spring!

Prepare for flooding

Flooding is the most frequent natural disaster in Canada, and the spring months increase the risk of flooding. To prepare your home in case of flooding, here are 10 tips to help you prepare for the winter thaw: ice stability before stepping on it.

1. Ensure your downspouts and eavestroughs are clear of debris and that they direct water away from your home.
2. Keep your basement floor drains clear. Clear the snow and ice from your walkways and driveway to help give the thawing snow a path to drain away.
3. Remove the snow from window wells and shovel the snow away from the foundation.
4. Try to clear street storm drains or culverts of leaves, debris and ice to aid in proper street drainage.
5. Inspect your foundation for cracks, where possible. Fill in any gaps with suitable exterior sealant (hire a professional if necessary).
6. Move valuable items out of your basement to higher levels in your home.
7. If you're heading out on the road, clear the snow and ice from your vehicle before you start out. Drive according to the conditions and never drive over flooded roads.
8. If flooding is imminent, and it is safe to do so, shut off electricity to the areas of the home that may be affected, and use sandbags or install flood shields or built-up barriers to help prevent water from entering through basement windows and doors.
9. Use salt, sand or ice melter to help keep walkways clear of ice as the runoff may refreeze and produce slippery surfaces. If someone slips and falls the property owner or even tenants/landlord could be held liable, resulting in potential financial liability and legal defence fees.
10. A side note on ice safety to consider: changing air temperatures affect ice thickness. While it is fun to skate on frozen lakes, rivers and ponds, be aware of



Be safe around ice

The colour of ice may be an indication of its strength. Clear blue ice is strongest. White opaque or snow ice is half as strong as blue ice. Opaque ice is formed by wet snow freezing on the ice. Grey ice is unsafe. The greyness indicates the presence of water.

Ice thickness should be:

- 15 cm for walking or skating alone
- 20 cm for skating parties or games
- 25 cm for snowmobiles

GREAT WEATHER FOR OUR 2026 CURL/SKI DAY

After an absence of two years, first due to 'no snow' and last year due to cold temperatures, the Curl/Ski Day was held on January 14 for all Meath Park students in Grades 7,8 and 9 to keep the annual event alive. This was our 17th Curl/Ski Day.

In March 2008 the Candle Lake Sno Skiers and the Candle Lake Curling Club hosted the first Curl/Ski Day with some Community Grant financing from Parks and Rec. with the rest supplied by Community businesses and Ski membership money from the Sno Skiers who were formed to clear and groom the Cross-Country ski trails as well as Baldy.

Parks and Recreation has been involved with this event through providing Community Grant money (from Sask Lottery sales) for ski instruction and rentals from Fresh Air Experience (FAE) in Prince Albert as well as curling club facility costs for both aspects of the day since inception. The ski trails and training grids have always been prepped by, first the Sno Skiers, then Parks and Recreation, and now Candle Lake Trails Advisory Board (CLTAB).

Thanks again for Sports, Culture and Recreation funding, FAE equipment and instruction, CLTAB groomers and assistant instructors and curling club members providing facility, instruction and, of course, wonderful food. From all reports the Meath Park Students and teacher supervisors were very impressed with our hospitality.

This event allows for introduction to very low-cost sports of skiing and curling and the social interaction that goes with it. Students, instructing adults and even parents can leave feeling very good about learning new things about themselves and their community. We all await next year!

Research shows that exercise can help you live longer. One [study](#) of adults ages 40 to 85 found that a small increase in physical activity could reduce annual deaths. Adding just 10 more minutes of daily exercise (that's about 1 game of pickleball) could prevent 110,000 deaths each year.

Other studies link regular exercise to longer life expectancies. According to a recent [report](#), the life expectancy of tennis players is nearly 10 years longer than people who don't exercise. The researchers noted that activities involving more social interaction showed the greatest longevity effects. Pickleball provides similar exercise effects as tennis, but pickleball is much easier to play and can be play inside at many facilities. RECENT INCIDENTS IN OUR COMMUNITY

The weekend of 6 February there were multiple thefts from the Glendale and Islandview subdivisions. These incidents demonstrate the benefits of having your video surveillance camera registered with COPPS as doing so saves the RCMP and CSO's a significant amount of time. In the recent cases, the CSO's went door to door checking if people had video surveillance cameras. The COPPS Video Surveillance Camera Registry is completely confidential and only share the residents' civic address and contact information with law enforcement.

VIDEO CAMERA SURVEILLANCE REGISTRY

Residents and business owners using video surveillance are encouraged to register their contact information with COPPS. In the event of an incident in your area contact information will be provided to law enforcement officers to speed up their investigation. Your information is kept secure and confidential. Snow Removal Etiquette

As we settle into the winter season, we kindly remind all cabin owners to follow proper snow-removal practices to help keep our community safe and accessible:

- East Gravel Pit – along Main Street
- West Lagoon Site – along Highway 265

You may occasionally see Village staff placing snow along road edges. This is done only after considering safety, visibility, and operational needs. Staff also plan ahead to relocate snow in spring, if required to prevent drainage concerns.

February Council Meeting Highlights

February Council Meeting Highlights include:

Zoning Bylaw Amendment - Council gave first reading to an amendment to the zoning bylaw that would permit an Automotive Repair and Parts Retail businesses and Shopping Centres in a C1 Commercial Zone. After required public notice, 2nd and 3rd reading will be considered at the March Regular Council Meeting.

Discretionary Use Approval - Council granted discretionary use approval to Pete Small for a home-based business at #8, 5th Ave for a Home Painting and Renovation business.

SHA Clinic License Renewal – Council approved a license with Sask Health Authority for a two-year period for the operation of the Health Clinic in the Community Centre.

Commercial Development Tax Incentive - Council adopted a Commercial Tax Incentive Policy establishing a clear, consistent, and transparent framework for granting tax exemptions for commercial development aligned with Council's strategic priorities. The policy grants a 3-5 year exemption for taxes on assessment for expansion or new construction.

Proposed 2026 Budget - Council tabled a motion to place the proposed 2026 Operations and Capital Budget on the agenda for consideration at the March 26, 2026 Regular Meeting of Council. The budget includes a 0.2 mill increase to cover increased costs due to inflation and will result in an average annual tax increase of \$56.60 for a property with and assessment of \$282,486.

Commercial Land Sale - Council authorized the execution of a Conditional Offer to Purchase with Jason Doell for approximately 4.07 acres of municipal land along Highway #265, subject to successful negotiation and approval of a Land Sale and Development Agreement on March 26, 2026, for the proposed development of a commercial shopping centre.
