

The Candle Lake Parks, Trails and Open Space Master Plan project is entering its final phase. The survey of recreation needs and perceptions (available at www. surveymonkey.com/r/CandleLake) will close on August 12th.

Preliminary survey results are suggesting:

- The top five recreational assets respondents have the greatest interest in are:
 - More trails for walking and cycling
 - Indoor fitness equipment
 - Trails for off road vehicles
 - More playgrounds
 - More picnic and informal gathering spaces



- Respondents have expressed greatest interest in using trails for:
 - Exercise and/or sight-seeing (76%)
 - Alternative transportation using vehicle less (64%)
 - All-terrain vehicle/snowmobile use (52%)
- Respondents feel the balance between lake use and protection at Candle Lake gets a score of 3.2 stars (out of 5)
- \cdot 48% of respondents expressed concern that future generations may not be able to enjoy fishing if current trends continue
- 64% of respondents believe people at Candle Lake, while aware they must remove all items brought to parks, open spaces, the waterfront or onto the water, they are not good at 'pack-in-pack-out' and do not do it consistently

News from the Resort Village

The Resort Village Public Works Department was busy throughout July as we worked to catch up on projects delayed due to heavy rainfall in June. This included roadway grading, gravelling and applying dust control. Summer staff have been challenged to keep up with wet conditions and fast-growing vegetation resulting from the abundant rain.

Throughout August we will be moving ahead with a number of major projects:

- The Flood Mitigation/Berm project along Highway 265, funded through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP), is designed to reduce the risk of flooding in the neighbouring subdivision during spring run off and heavy rains by diverting water and enlarging the retention pond to increase storage capacity. This project began last winter and was scheduled to be completed in June once the area had dried up from the spring run off. Unfortunately, an extraordinary rainfall event in mid June resulted in a need to reschedule the project. Work will recommence in mid August and will include shaping the ditch, grading the walking trail, fencing the retention pond and installing an automated pumping station. The project includes the added benefit of creating a walking path along the berm to extend our walking trail from Lakeview Drive to Cessna Street.
- The Village is committed to continuing to improve drainage in the community and has set aside funding for 2022 with the intent of continuing this process in future years. Several drainage improvements will occur in the Lakeview subdivisions this summer including ditching and installation of automated pumping stations.
- The walking path system along Highway 265 will be extended to connect the walking trail along Main Street to Bereskin Drive. The crosswalk to the intersection will be relocated to improve safety.
- The Main Street trail from Simon Lehne to the minigolf course will be enhanced with new base material added to the existing trail.

- Village crews will attend to minor drainage improvements elsewhere in the Village as time permits and projects which require more planning will be scheduled for future years. Village crews will continue with regular roadway maintenance throughout the summer. While some projects will be completed by Village crews, others will be contracted out.
- The Village has also established a budget for annual road repairs/reconstruction. This summer roadway repairs will be made in the Glendale/Denmore and Island View subdivisions. As our budget permits, in future years we will continue to make improvements like rebuilding existing roads. As projects are planned and scheduled, property owners in the affected areas will be advised of the work that will take place in their neighbourhood.
- Our Public Works Department will be installing several memorial benches throughout the community and an outdoor chess board on the Community Hall grounds.

As we endeavour to complete the work planned for this year, we anticipate that the next few months will be very busy for crews at the Resort Village of Candle Lake!





Emergency Services Master Plan to be Developed

The Resort Village of Candle Lake (RVCL) is inviting proposals from interested suppliers to develop an Emergency Services Master Plan that will provide a strategic framework for the delivery of fire protection and emergency services in the RVCL.

The proposal will assist in identifying priorities and opportunities in the provision of emergency services to the community; the information gathered will help guide the Fire Department and Council in making decisions that best meet the needs of the community. The successful proponent will work with the RVCL Emergency Services Team to ensure the data collection is valid and reliable.
