Village of Candle Lake Policing Report April 1st, 2021 to June 30th, 2021

Nipawin/Smeaton RCMP responded to or initiated 49 calls for service within the Village of Candle Lake during the time frame of April 1st, 2021 to June 30th, 2021. There were 303 other occurrences in the surrounding RM.

- Smeaton Detachment is currently at half strength. We have 1 member on PAT leave and Cst. Maynard has transferred to Melfort Det. One of our goals is to ensure that we spend as much time as able in the Candle lake area during the summer months. We recognize that the Village area will be seeing a large increase in population especially once the Covid restrictions are rescinded.
- During this reporting period, we were able to work with partner agencies to conduct stop checks. Over 300 contacts were made with the public on the May long weekend. The purpose of the checks is two fold. Firstly to raise awareness and presence as well as educating the motoring public of traffic infractions (only 1 ticket was issued). Secondly, these joint activities allow all of the members from partnering agencies to get to know each other and develop positive working relationships that benefit the community by sharing resources to respond to calls for service.
- There have only been a small number of Covid 19 related complaints over the past months regarding compliance with health restrictions. No fines have been issued.
- As always, I encourage you to remind the people in the village of the importance of reporting incidents to police. We can only help if we know what is going on. Crime Stoppers is also an avenue of reporting for people if they wish anonymity. The COPPS program has also been active in the community and has been passing on information regarding suspicious activity to the RCMP. Please keep me informed of any issues within the village that we can help with.
